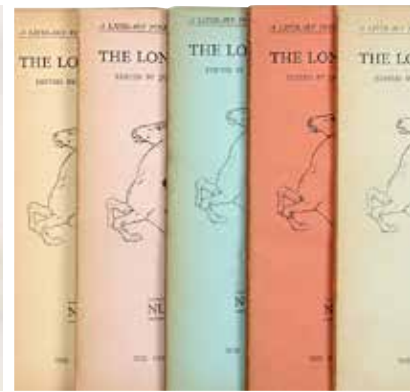
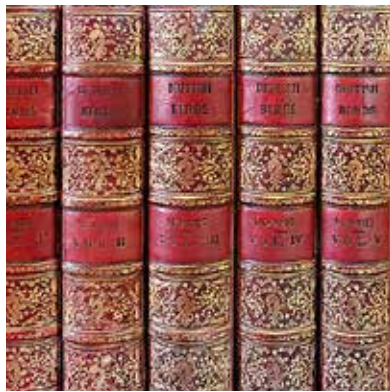

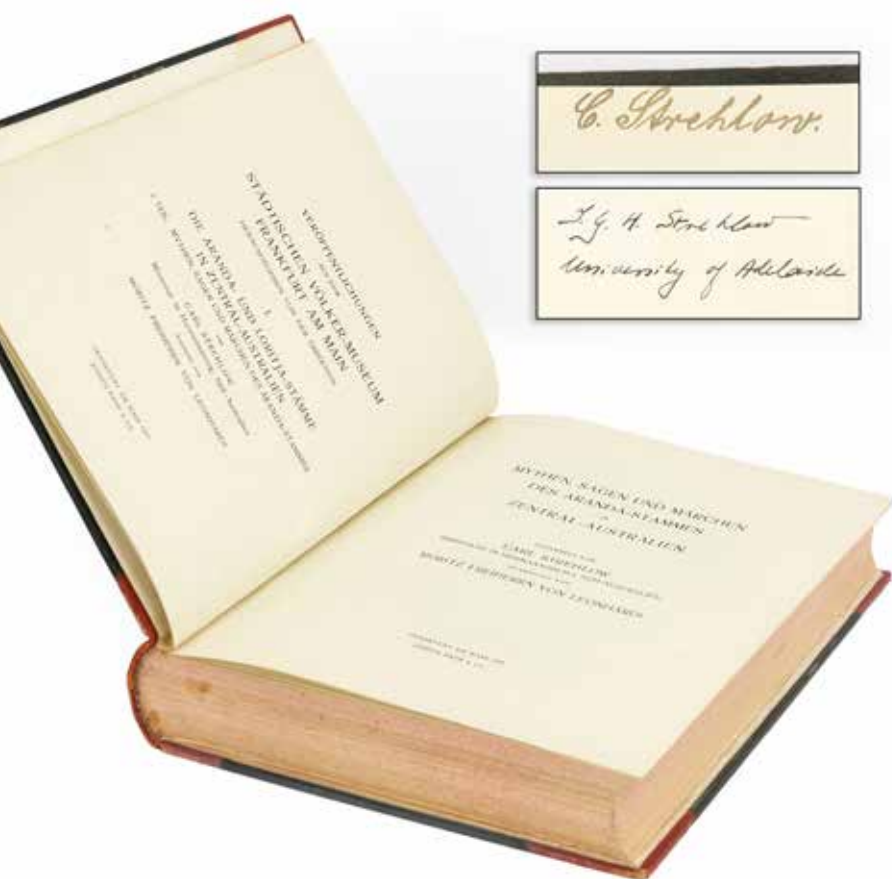

STREHLOW, PASTOR CARL **DIE ARANDA- UND LORITJA-STÄMME** **IN ZENTRAL-AUSTRALIEN**

Quarto, seven parts bound as one, with
a folding map, 11 plates (5 in colour) and
numerous text illustrations, plus 9 loose
folding genealogical tables. Later half
leather; in excellent condition.

The author's acclaimed magnum opus
on the myths, legends, material culture
and customs of the Arrernte and Luritja
people of Central Australia. Very rare in
any event, especially complete with the
seventh part, publication of which was
delayed by the First World War.

This particular example is beyond
compare: it comes from the personal
collection of the author, Carl Friedrich
Theodor Strehlow (1871-1922),
missionary at Hermannsburg (Ntaria)
from 1894 to 1922. He has signed
the first page of one volume, and
made in excess of 240 corrections
in ink throughout the text. The later
ownership details of his son, the linguist
Theodor George Henry (Ted) Strehlow
(1908-1978), are on the front flyleaf.

FOUR DUPLICATE LETTER BOOKS CONTAINING 92 'KOMITEE-BERICHTE' [COMMITTEE REPORTS] COMPILED BETWEEN JANUARY 1914 AND AUGUST 1922 AND ADDRESSED TO THE FINKE RIVER MISSION BOARD IN ADELAIDE.

A total of 359 pages of text (345 pages in carbon duplicate, and 14 tipped-in pages of manuscript in German shorthand). All four volumes have 'Komitee-Berichte' (Committee Reports) in Strehlow's hand on the front cover. In excellent condition.

This material comes from the residual archive of Pastor Carl Strehlow's son, Theodor George Henry (Ted) Strehlow (1908-1978), the eminent Australian linguist, with a strong connection to the languages and people of Central Australia.

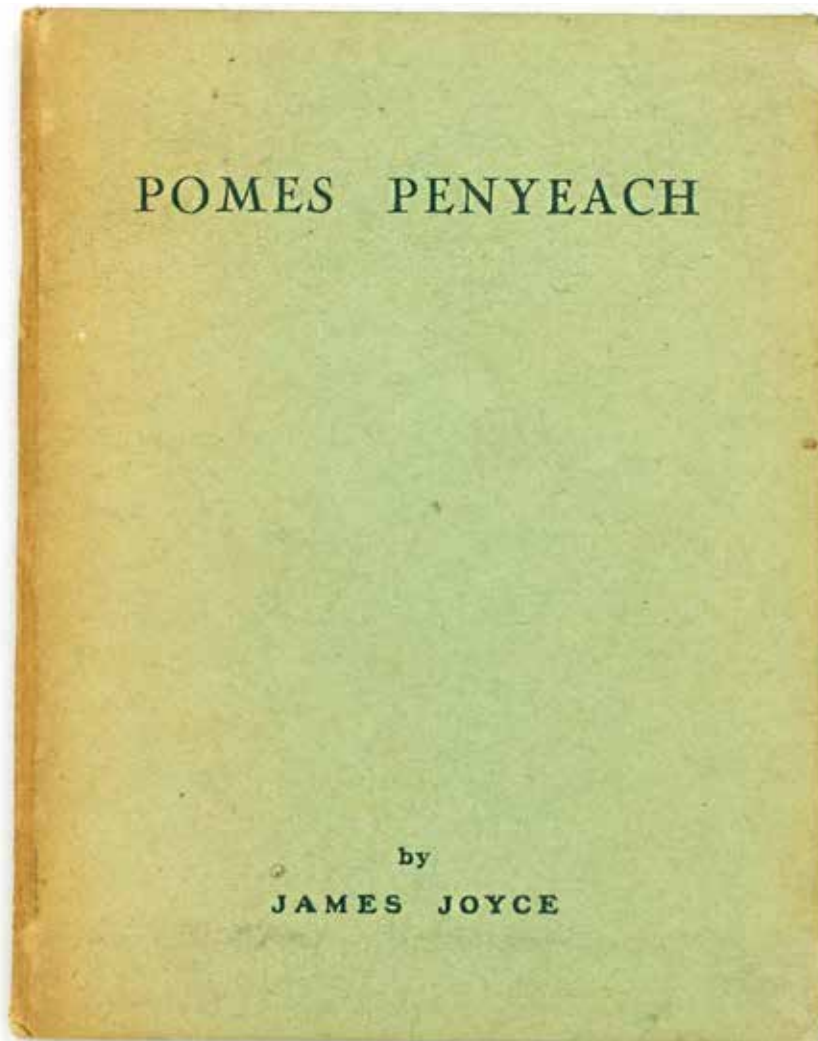

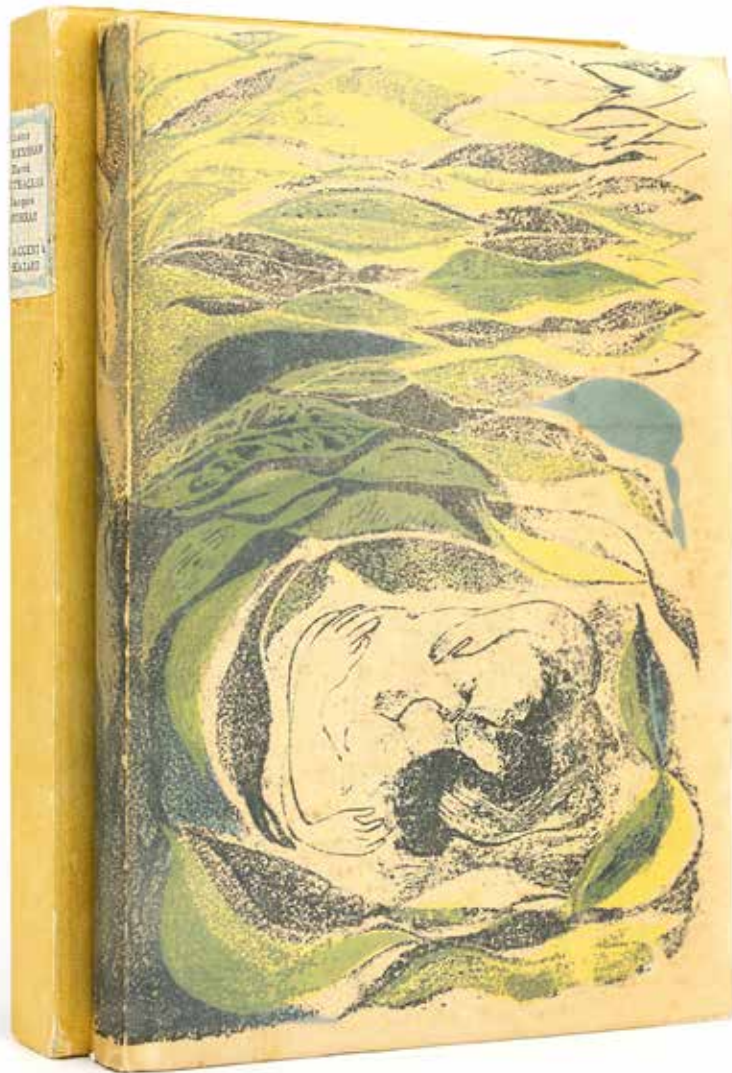

This short collection of poems was sold for 12 pennies (1 shilling) or 12 francs and contains 13 poems, hence 'Pomes Penyeach' (the thirteenth poem being the 'tilly', the Irish term for the thirteenth item in a 'baker's dozen' and also the title of the first poem).

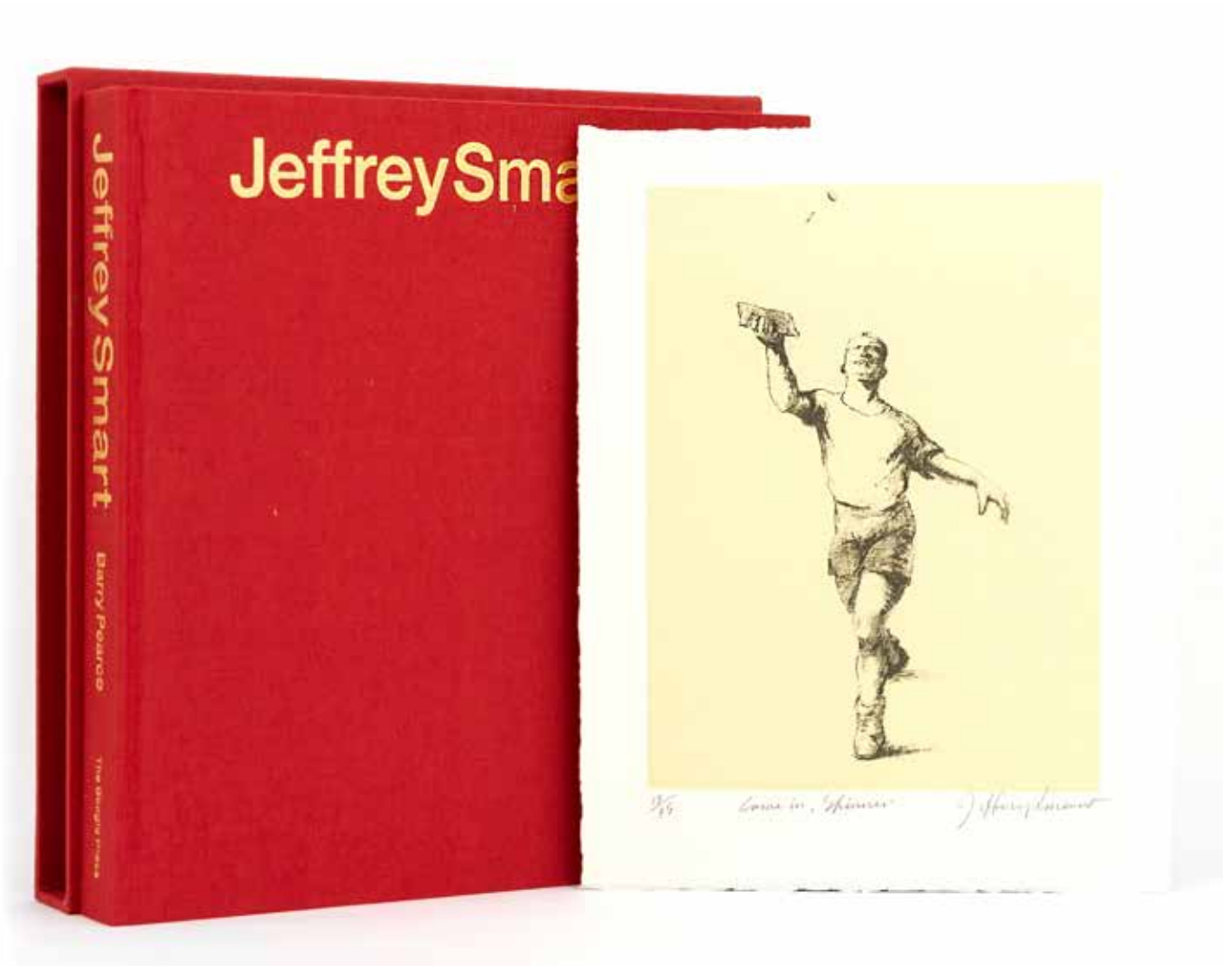

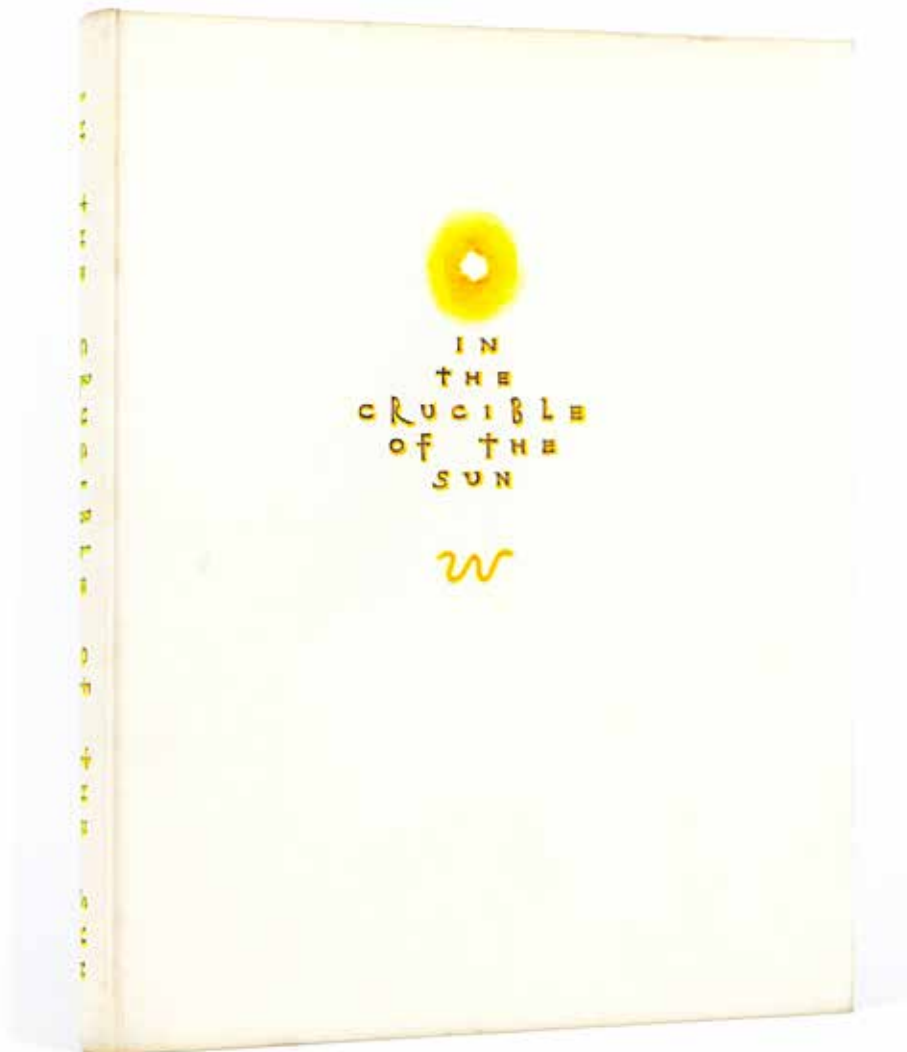

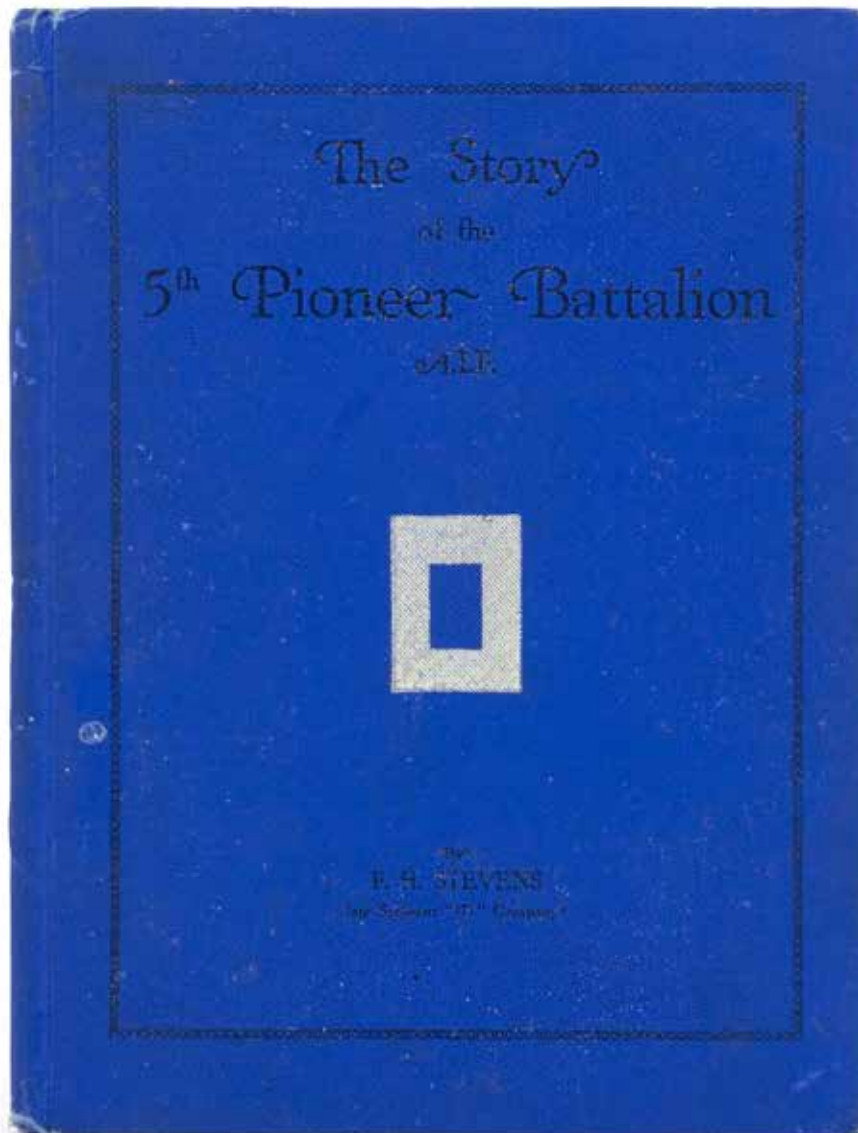

A lavish pictorial history of King Ranch's vast Australian pastoral holdings, with text and illustrations by Tom Lea. The Texan cattle conglomerate's Australian ventures were instigated by Robert J. Kleberg Jr around 1952, and were key to introducing the Santa Gertrudis breed to Australia. The latter half of the book comprises short descriptions and illustrations of properties at Milton Park, Deltroit, Woodlands, Elgin Downs, New Twin Hills, Avon, Disney, Barkly Downs, Lake Nash, Georgina, Brunette Downs, Mount House, and Tully River.

Provenance: Patricia Bridges OAM ASM (1921-2017), grande dame of Australian golf, with her ownership signature and label.

The book includes a five-page Honor Roll, and a preface by Lieutenant-Colonel Herbert Gordon Carter, DSO (1885-1963), the battalion's commanding officer from August 1916 to the end of the war. The book is based heavily on Carter's diary of the battalion's movements and operations from the early days in Egypt to the Armistice.

The complete roman-fleuve presented here in three volumes. Terence Kilmartin's extensive revision of C.K. Scott Moncrieff's original translation was first published by Random House in the same year as this Folio Society edition (also as a three-volume set, and with the same collation).

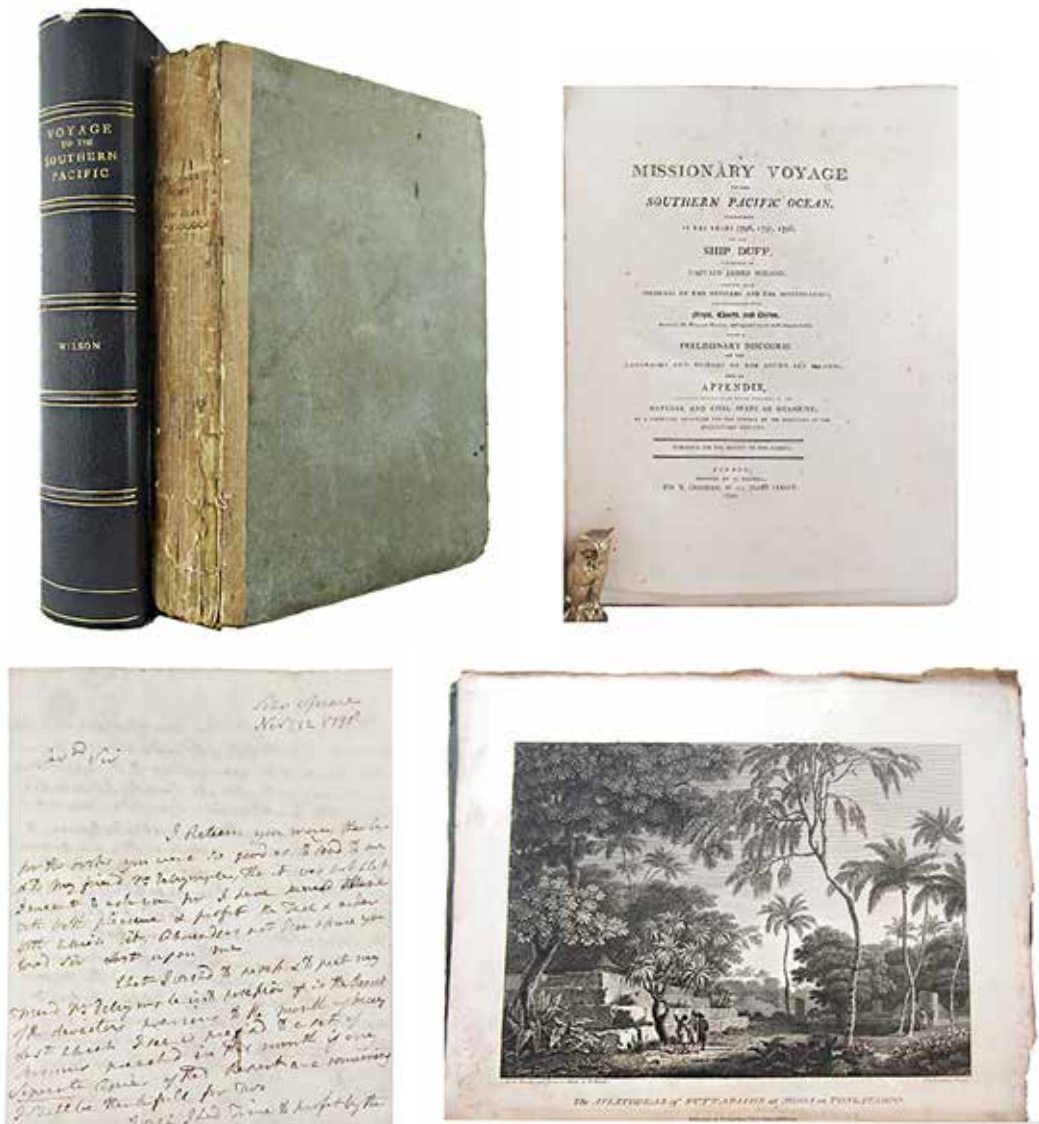

First edition of Part I and Third edition of Part II, being the First edition of the complete work. *With an autograph letter, signed, from Erasmus Darwin to Sir Joseph Banks, dated October 14 [17]81. Accompanied by a shorter ALs from Francis Darwin (son of Charles and great-grandson of Erasmus) to John Enys, a Cornish-born amateur naturalist who lived for several years in New Zealand.



Erasmus Darwin's letter to Banks is not addressed, and was previously known only from a copy made in the 1830s for the botanist and antiquary Dawson Turner (1775-1858). A summary of the letter (misdated Oct. 24), is included in *The Banks Letters. A Calendar of the Manuscript Correspondence of Sir Joseph Banks*, by Warren R. Dawson (British Museum, London, 1958).

Compiled from journals of the officers and the missionaries; and illustrated with Maps, Charts, and Views, drawn by Mr. William Wilson, and engraved by the most eminent Artists. With a preliminary discourse on the geography and history of the South Sea Islands; and an appendix, including details never before published, of the natural and civil state of Otaheite; by a committee appointed for the purpose by the directors of the Missionary Society. Printed by S. Gosnell, for T. Chapman, London, 1799. First edition, large paper issue, with the larger map of Fiji. Ferguson 301; Hill 1894.

The list of Subscribers includes 'Sir J. Banks, President of the Royal Society', and an autograph letter from Banks to Haweis is loosely inserted (two pages, small 4to, with conjugate postmarked address leaf). Written from his residence in Soho Square, it is dated Nov. 12 1798, shortly before the publication of this book. According to Hill, the editor of the work was Dr. Thomas Haweis, one of the founders of the London Missionary Society.

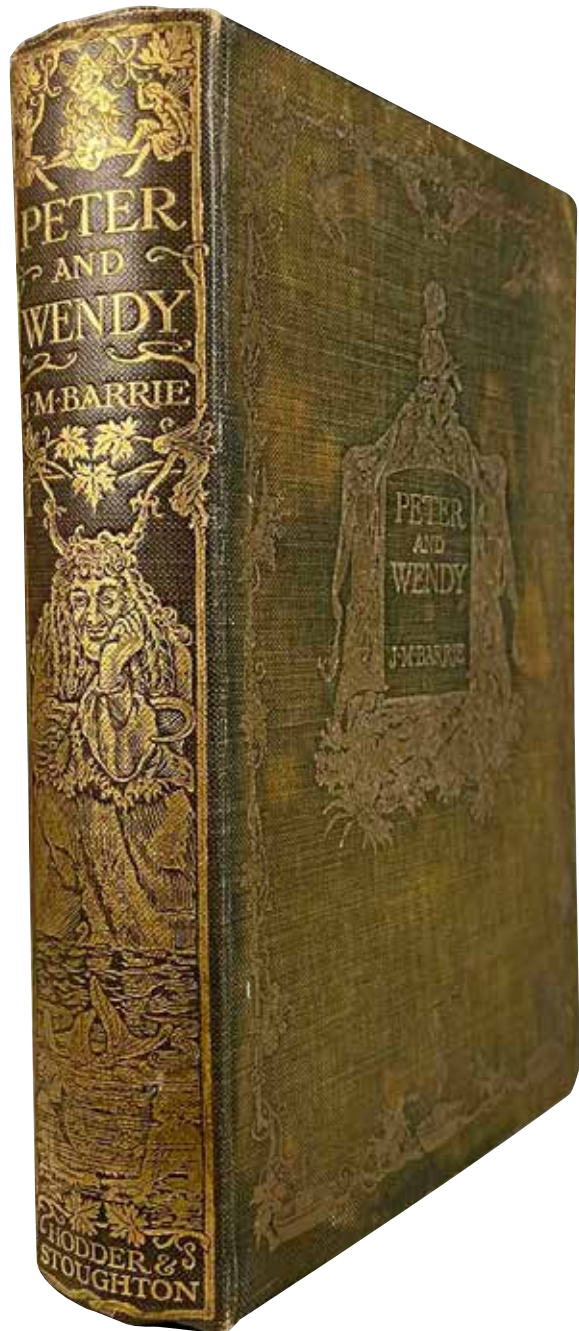

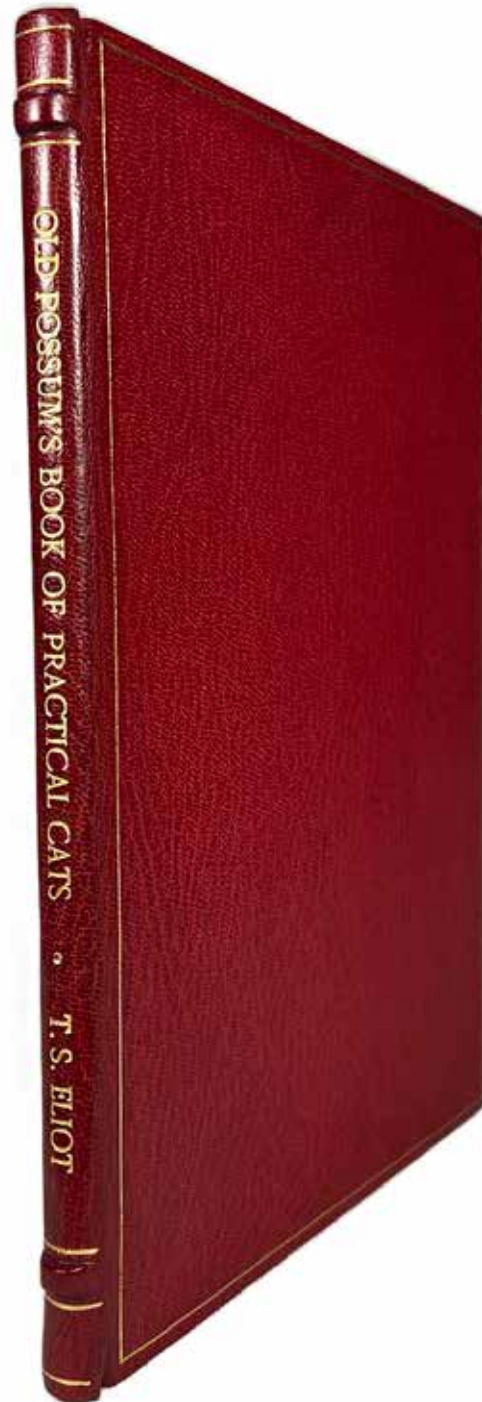

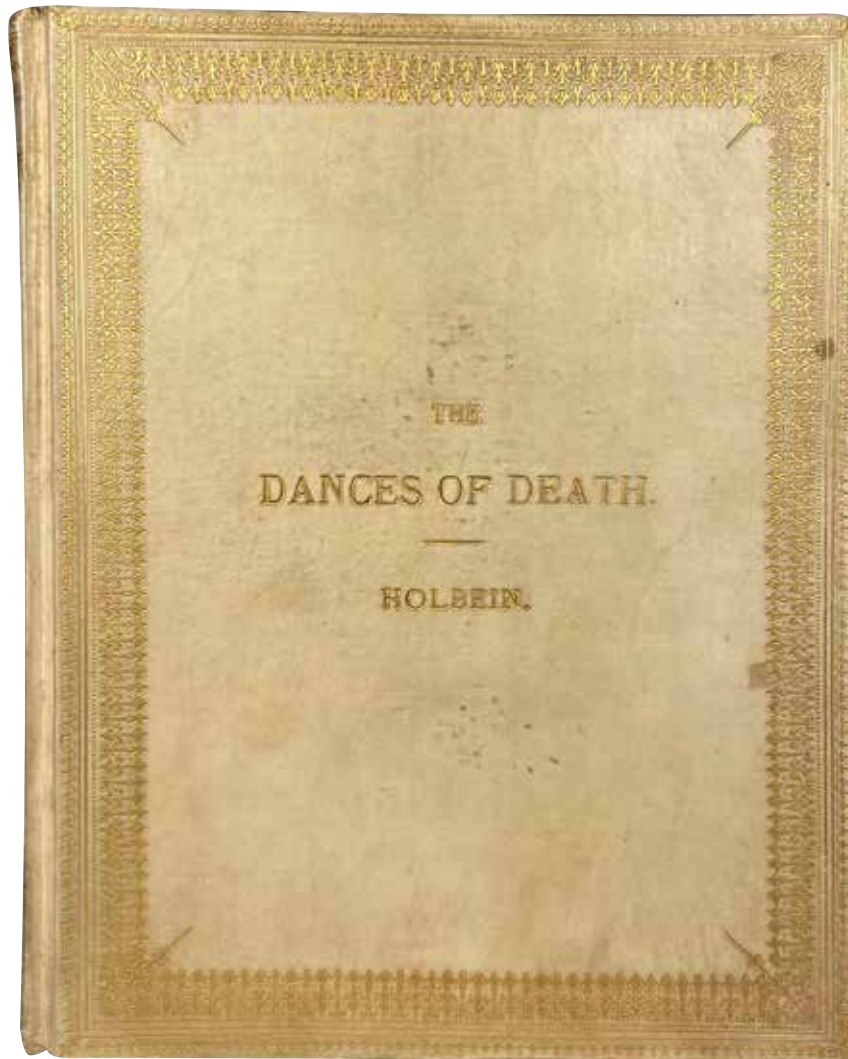

This is the first edition, second issue, without the L'Envoi leaf: "Kingsley had second thoughts about this while the book was being printed, and he had the leaf removed, but not before a few hundred copies of the book had already gone forth". (Gottlieb, *Early Children's Books and Their Illustration*, 113). A very good copy of this children's classic.

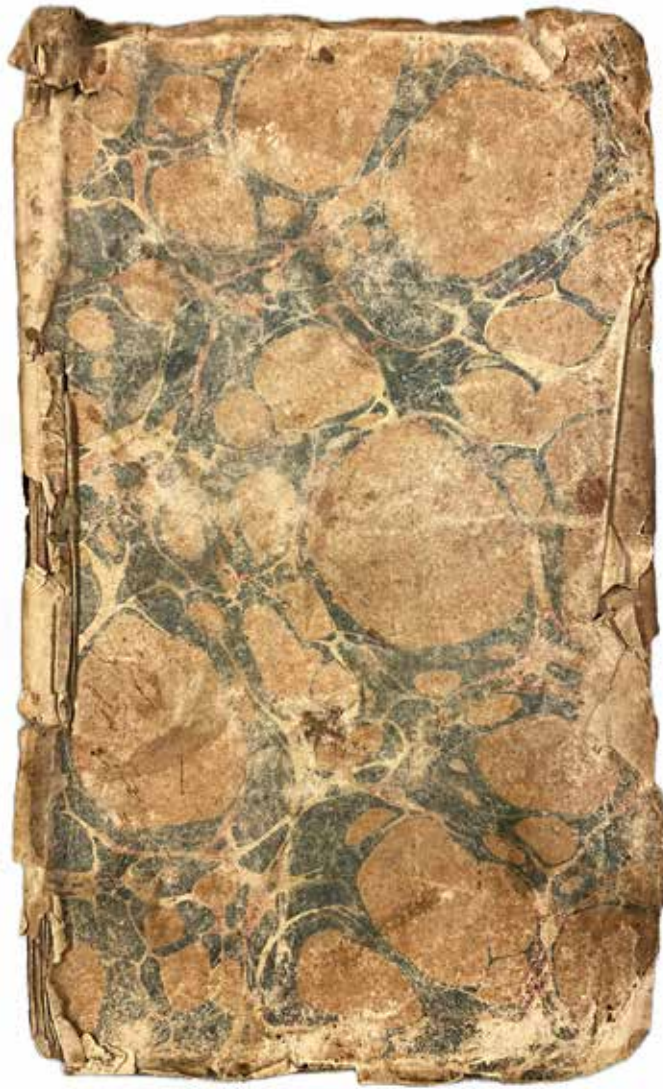

Francis Henry Vivian Voss (1860-1940) was an outstanding medical practitioner who built a private hospital in Rockhampton in 1900 and became a foundation fellow of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons in 1927. He was known to have a fine library.

Lacks half title and advertisement, otherwise complete. The paper wraps are considerably edgeworn and frayed; the spine is largely chipped with the gatherings exposed. The portrait is stained and there is some offsetting from the print to the title page which is chipped at the head and bears an ownership inscription in ink. The remaining leaves are toned at the edges, worn and chipped with a large open tear at the tail of p.23. Comment penned on verso of top cover reads, "A most admirable specimen of Autobiography to be met with in all literature. M.S."

Written shortly before his death, Hume had intended his Life to be prefixed to his next published edition of his Works. The Life ends on p.35 and the rest is taken up with Adam Smith's letter to W. Strahan describing Hume's last days. [Jessop p.39] (bookseller inventory #3466)

This Darton & Harvey edition, printed the same year as the first Stockdale edition contains two plates to a page which very closely copy (often reversed) those in the Stockdale; "most notably in this respect is the strikingly Blakean shepherd imitated from Blakes first engraving". Bentley, Blake Books, p.566.

The rare catalogue of the Society's inaugural exhibition held at the Garden Palace which had been purpose-built for the Sydney International Exhibition in 1879. It succinctly captures the impressive depth of Australian Art in the late nineteenth century.

An impressive two hundred and twenty oils, watercolours and drawings were hung: Mrs. Alfred Williams' (Florence E. Williams) painting Ophelia, the most expensive at £75, was highly praised by the Bulletin art critic at the time; W. C. Piguenit's Sydney Harbour from North Shore priced at £52.10.0 (in modern times it reached \$198,000 at Melbourne auction); works by Collingridge, Halstead and Short; and seven New Zealand watercolours by J C Hoyte (the President of the Society).

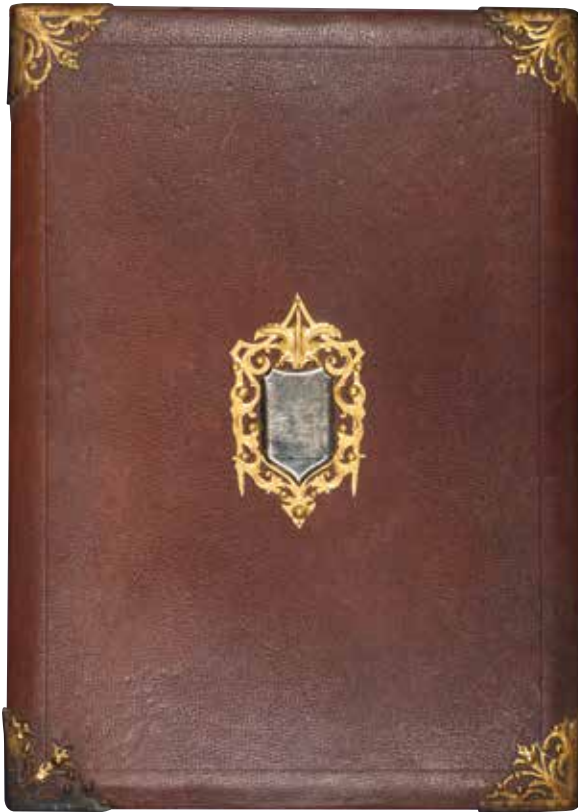

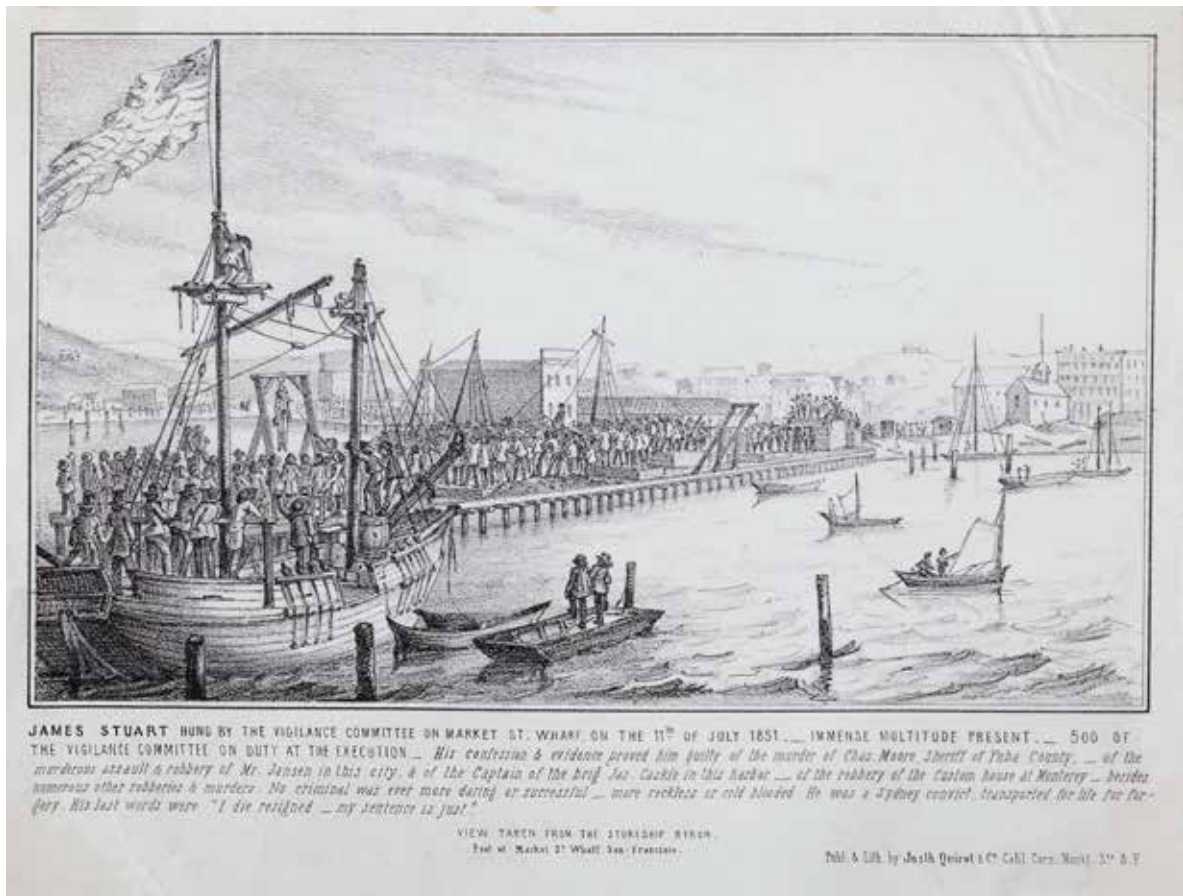

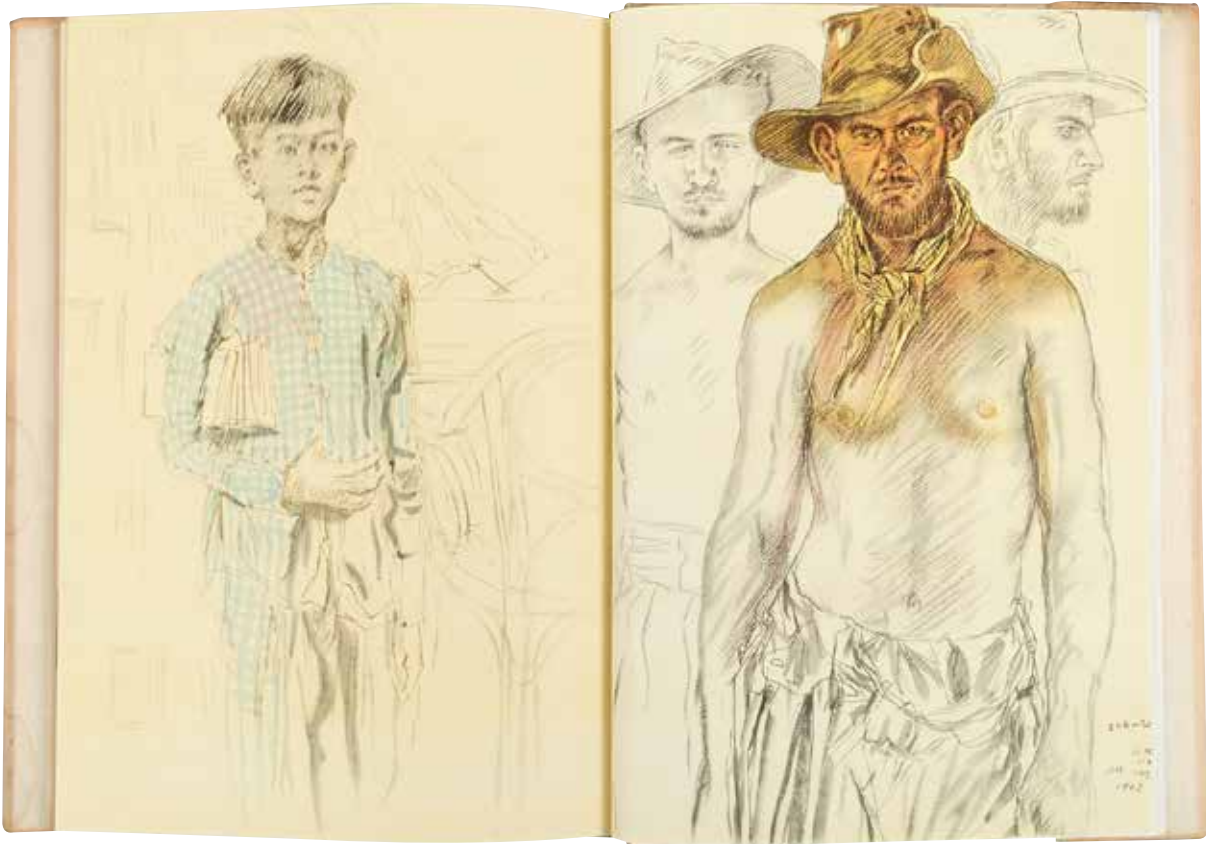

In 786 theologian and abbot, St Paschasius Radbertus was left as an infant at the door of Notre Dame convent in Soissons, France, a nunnery founded during the Merovingian era between 658 and 666. He was raised by the nuns there before receiving an education from the monks of St. Peter's in Soissons. Radbertus wrote a lengthy sermon on the Feast of the Assumption, known as *Cogitis me* (You think of me), a section of which is included on this leaf. It was addressed directly to the Soisson nuns. Because of the beauty of the writing, some passages, as here, were used as lessons in the breviary in reference to Mary.

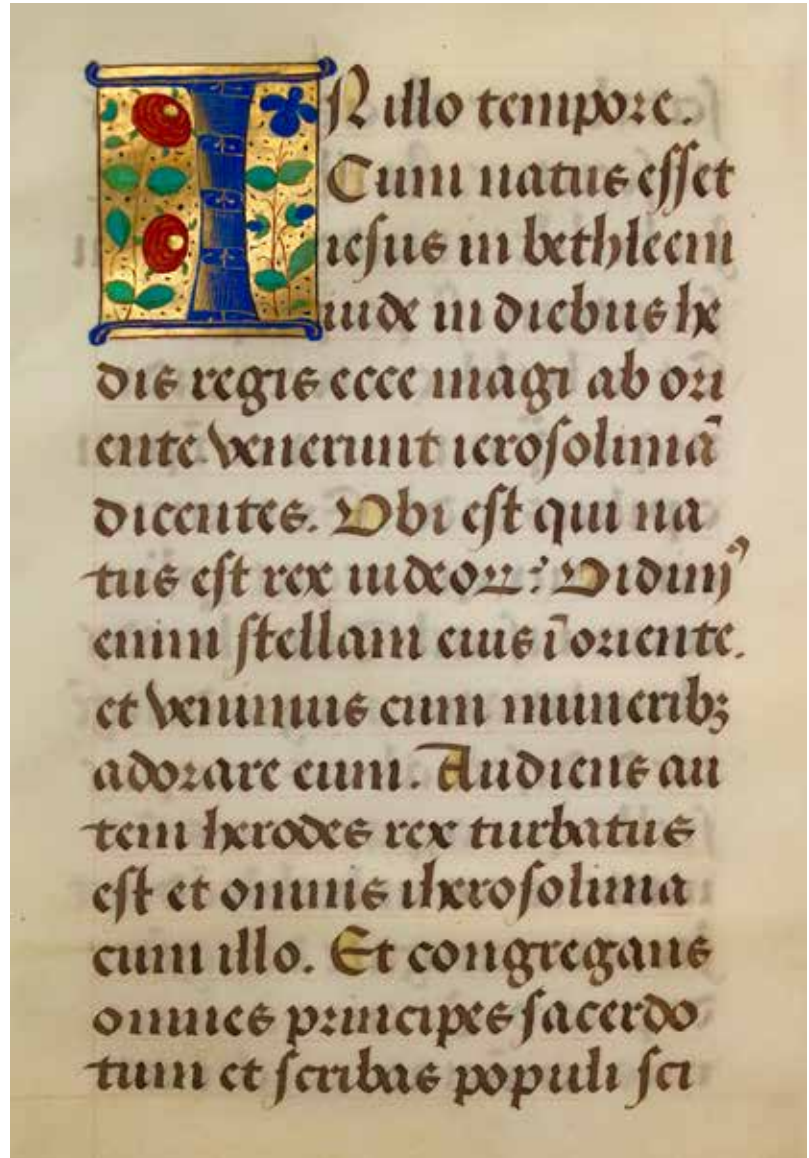

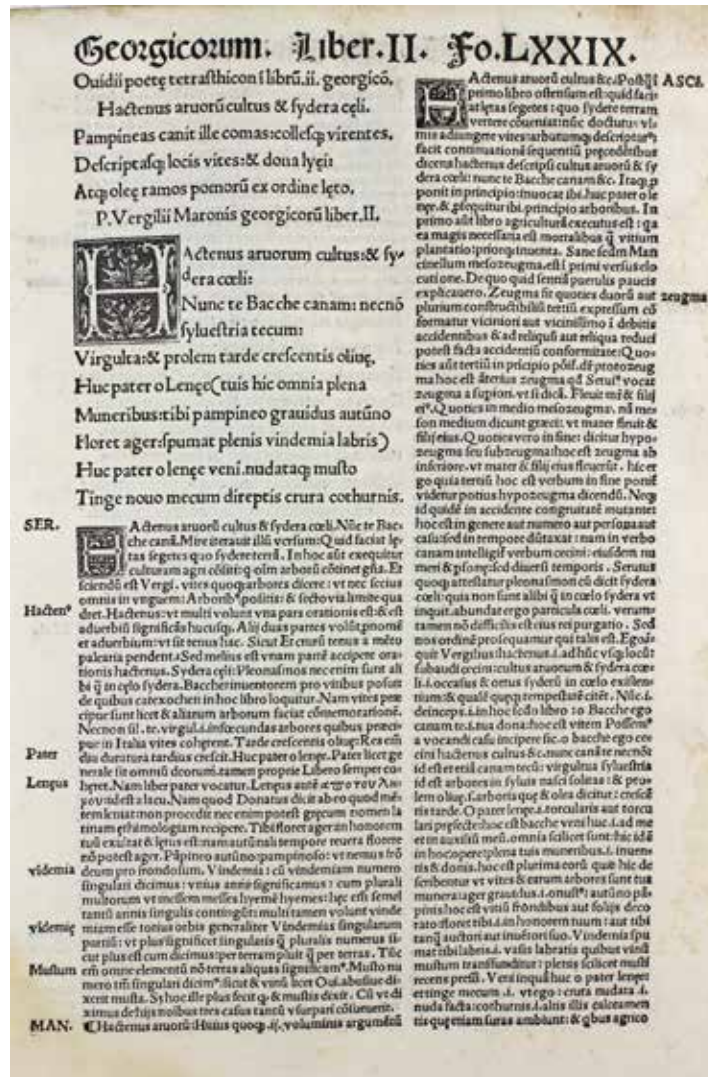

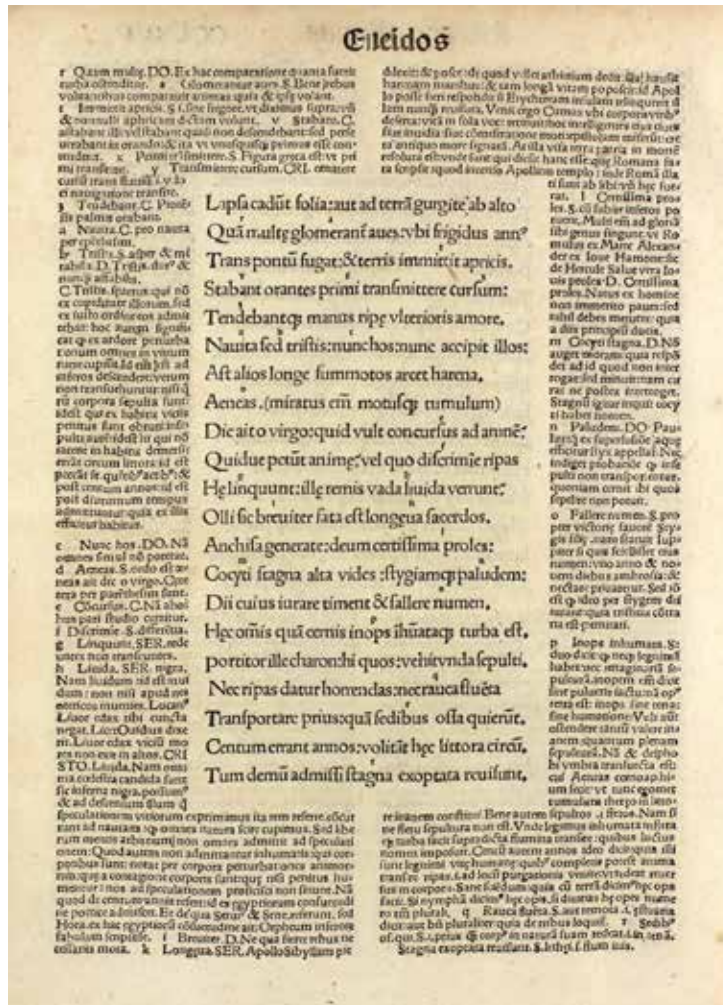
Of all classical Latin poets, Virgil has held the most secure place in the canon of great authors. His works became school texts in ancient Rome and his perceived affinity with Christianity meant that his poetry was widely read in the Middle Ages. The Georgics, (from Greek, "On Working the Earth") is a didactic poem by Virgil, likely published in 29 BC.

A section of the English translation of Virgil's text, beginning at the large woodcut initial 'H' (*Hactenus aruorum cultus et sidera caeli*) is:

"Thus far the tillage of the fields and the stars of heaven: now you, Bacchus, will I sing, and with you the forest saplings, and the offspring of the slow-growing olive. Hither Lenean sire! A leaf from Grüninger's first edition (Strassburg) with the gloss by Sebastian Brant.

The Aeneid is an epic poem in 12 books that tells the story of the foundation of Rome from the ashes of Troy. It was probably written in Rome from 30-19 BC during the reign of the Emperor Augustus. The poem is named after the Trojan hero Aeneas, the son of Venus (Aphrodite in Greek mythology) and Anchises, a Trojan aristocrat. Aeneas leads the survivors from the sack of Troy through the Mediterranean, and ultimately to the site of (future) Rome.

A section of the English translation of Virgil's text beginning at the last line of Recto (*Quam multa in silvis autumni frigore primo*) and continuing on Verso reads:

"As many as leaves having glided fall in the forest at the first cold of autumn, or as many as birds are gathered toward land from the deep whirlpool, when the cold year puts them to flight across the sea and sends them into sunny lands. And the dead stood praying to be the first to voyage over, and reached out their hands in longing for the distant shore, but the woeful boatman, Charon, chooses these and those and fends off others, forcing them from the sandy strand."hv

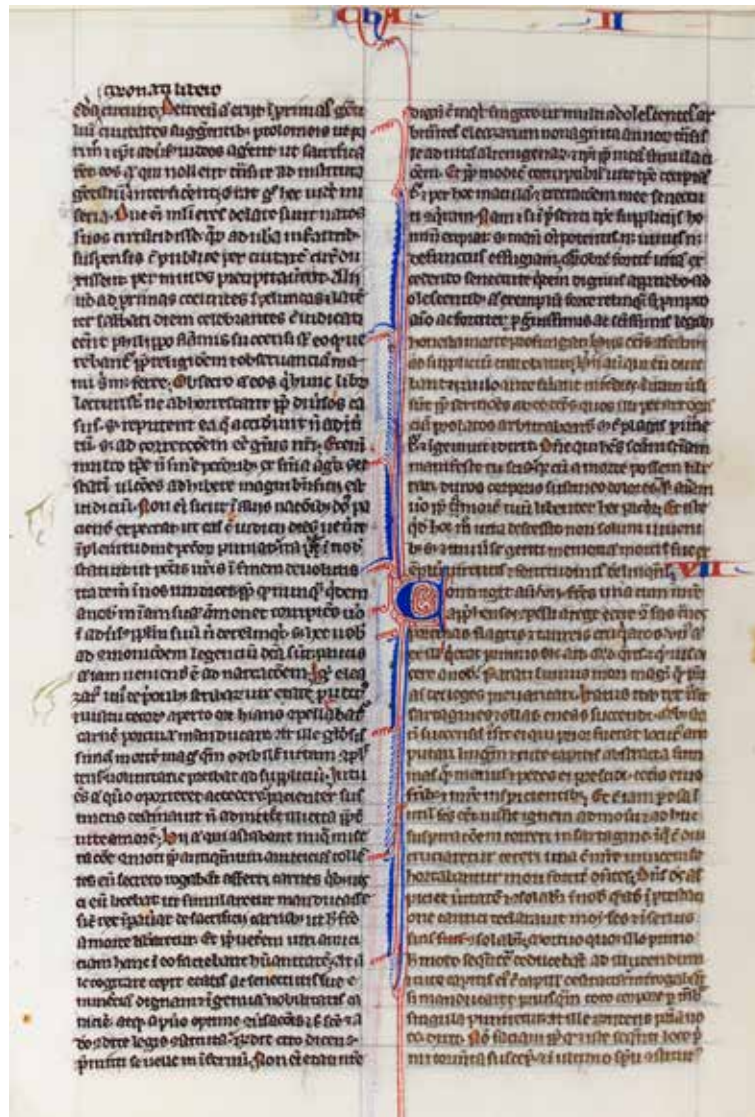

Text in Latin written on vellum in a particularly fine rounded gothic script. One two-line illuminated initial 'D' in liquid gold on a red ground outlined in black. A green tendril radiates from the initial into the margin, bearing foliage, gold bezants and blue flowers, possibly speedwell, which with its four petals, symbolises the crucifixion cross. Four other decorative versal initials in gold on alternating red and blue grounds.

The extremely small size of this leaf can be explained thus: Medieval piety involved substantial elements of public display, and the small but emergent urban bourgeoisie, mostly merchants or administrators in the growing royal bureaucracies were intent on imitating their superiors. So the Book of Hours became something of a chic devotional accessory, especially for women, an incongruity that occasionally attracted disapproving comment. Eustache Deschamps, the great French poet of the late 14th century, put his satire into verse when he imagined the thoughts of a bourgeois lady who yearns for a Book of Hours that "*is as graceful and gorgeous as me... So the people will gasp when I use it, That's the prettiest prayer-book in town!*"

Latin text written in black & brown ink on fine vellum in an extremely precise gothic minuscule script in two columns of 47 lines. The scribe appears to have used two different inks. The production of small format bibles flourished in Paris in the 13th century. They were known as "pocket Bibles" because they could be carried in the folds of the habits of itinerant friars. In order to reduce the thickness of the parchment, these bibles used calf skin produced north of the Alps which was able to be processed on both sides, whilst retaining its white colouring and quality.

Immediately below the woodcut of Memphis is its description, which begins: *Memphis nunc Chayrum dicta regia Egiptios...* (Memphis, now called Cairo, the royal city in Egypt, was built by Ogelous, the king of Egypt and was named Memphis after his daughter. It is located in the most convenient part of the region where the river Nile divides into many branches...and almost surrounds the city, giving access to shipping.) Notes on the woodcut illustration comment that "there is nothing 'eastern' about this scene, and certainly nothing Egyptian. The artist depicts the town as securely girded, with the usual battlements, turrets, towers and gates. To the left is a stream, which we must assume to be the Nile. On its banks grows an iris...but we see no reeds or rushes in which a little Moses might be concealed."

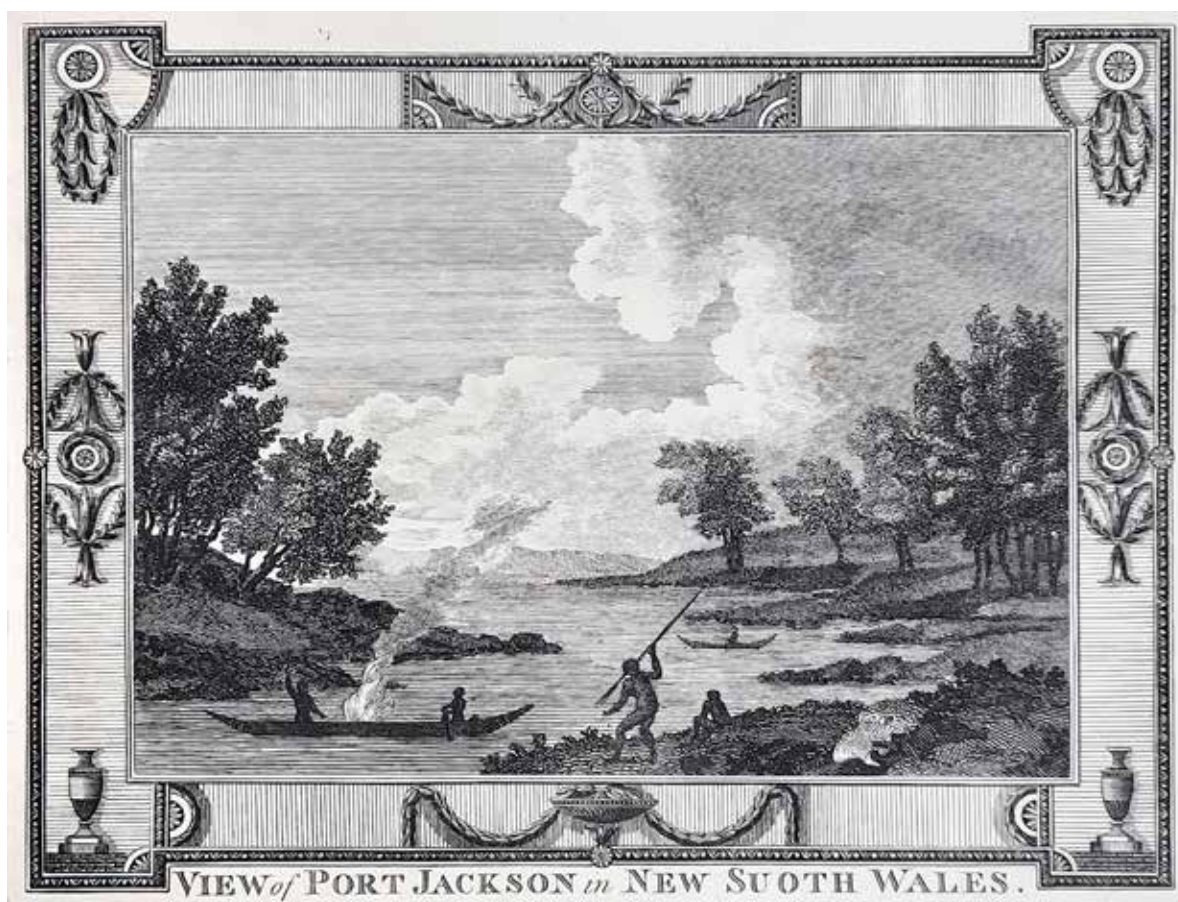

One of the great rarities of Western Australian colonial art. The scene shows the escaped Fenians in a whaleboat attempting to reach the Catalpa while being pursued by the water police and the British steamer the *Georgette*. From 1865 to 1867 the British authorities became increasingly concerned with republican demonstrations, and began arresting supporters of the Irish Republican Brotherhood commonly called the Fenians. The Fenians had supporters in America known as the Fenian Brotherhood. Sixty two were transported to the penal colony at Fremantle, landing there in January 1868. Among this group was John Boyle O'Reilly who managed to escape while working in a convict gang near Bunbury. He was helped by an Irish settler who arranged a passage for him on an American whaler the *Vigilant* in February 1869. He was unsuccessful in getting on that vessel but finally escaped on another whaler, the *Gazelle*, a few days later. While in America, O'Reilly with the help of the Fenian Brotherhood arranged a rescue of the remaining Fenians from the Fremantle goal.

This map is identified as being from the 1592 Latin edition by the text on the verso with the third line from the top ending with Africam, the last line being in two columns with ANTONIVS VERONENSIS and FRANCISCVS BELLEFORESTIVS, Gallic appearing in the respective columns and Gallice. the last word on the last line.

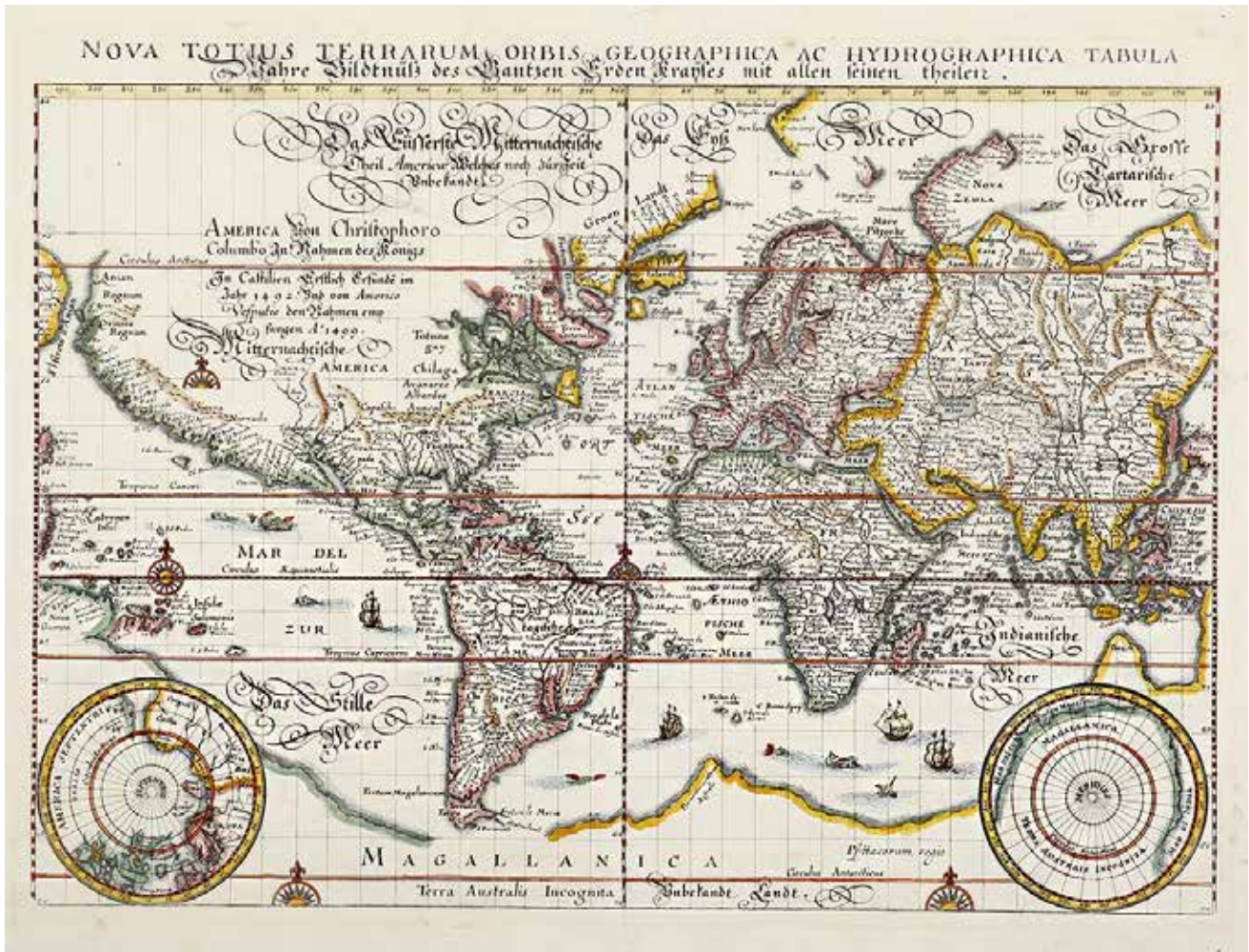

From Maffei's published detailed account of the Portuguese accomplishments throughout India and the East in 1588 titled, *Historiarum Indicarum* which was then printed in a number of editions most of which did not include this world map, these are; Venice, Bergamo and Antwerp. This world map only appears in two editions of Maffei's, *Historiarum...*; the first of these was published in Cologne in 1589 and the second in 1593, this being the first edition of the map. This superbly engraved world map was based on Ortelius's 1570 world map. As Rodney Shirley notes; 'A skilful engraver' has much enhanced the title by adding strapwork elements and inserted further ornate strapwork designs in each corner. Many of the new place names appearing along the North American west coast were provided to Ortelius by Richard Hakluyt from his accounts of recent explorations. A bulge in South America which appeared in Ortelius's earlier world map, has now been corrected and the Solomon Islands are marked.

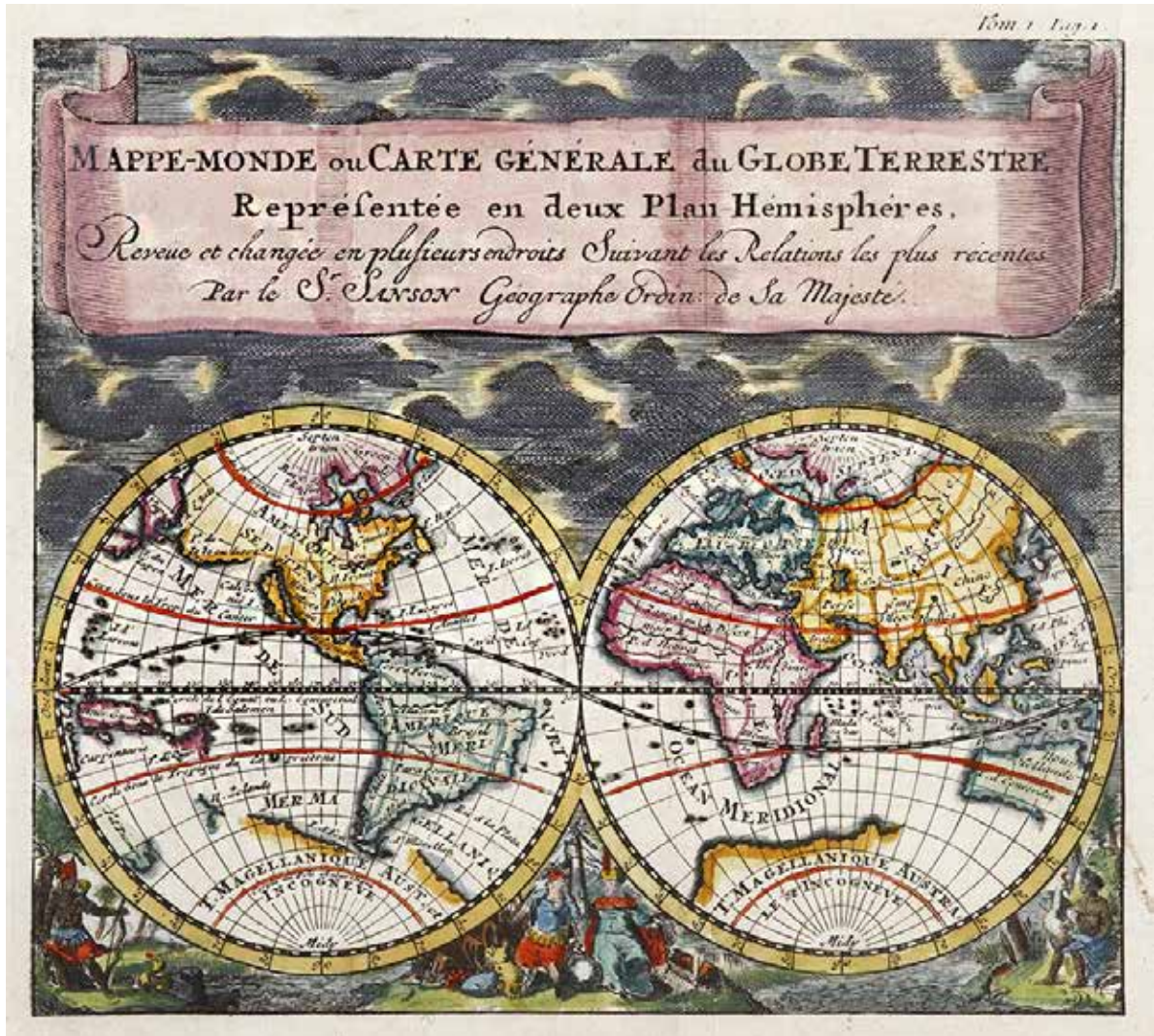

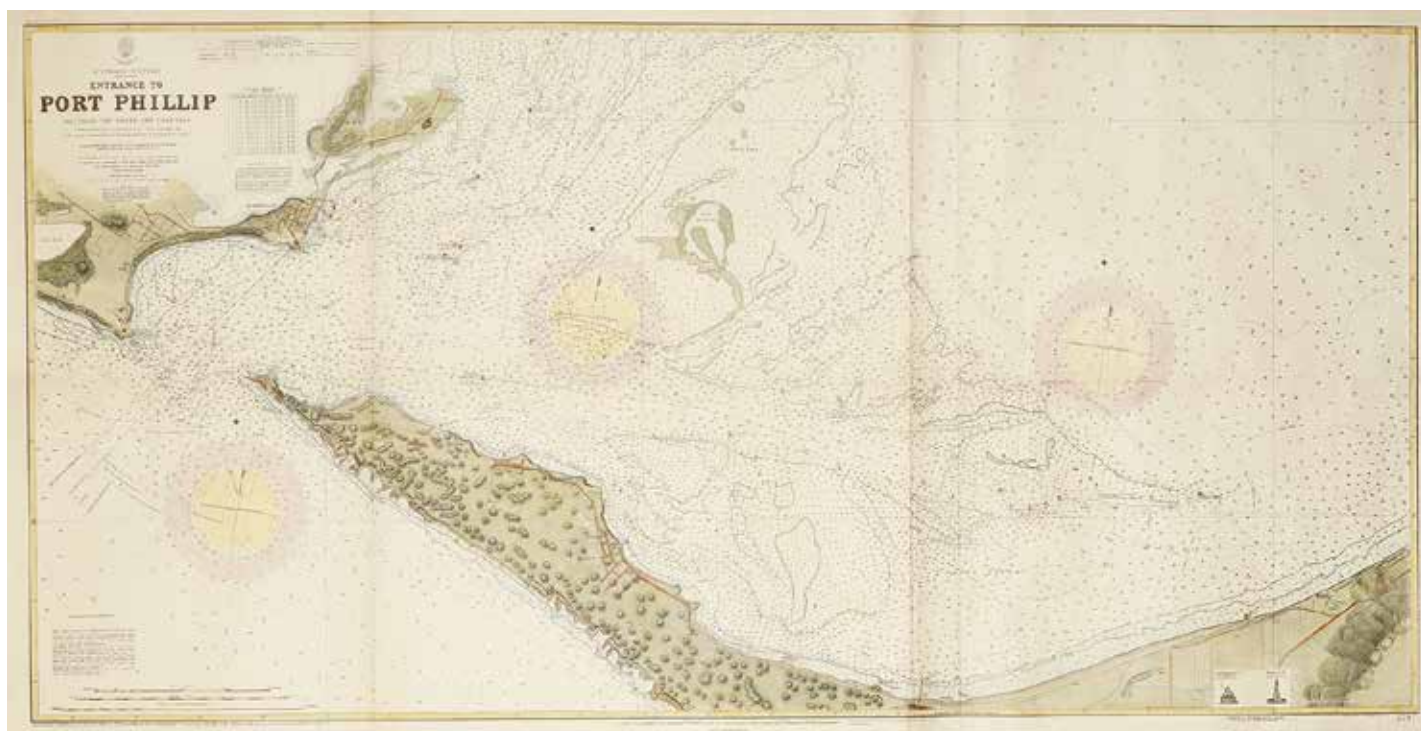

The horticulturalist Joseph Sayce offered an unsolicited design as a gift, which was accepted in 1873. Further refinements to the design were made by the project's curator, William Guilfoyle (the noted Director of the Royal Botanic Gardens). Guilfoyle contributed exotic plant varieties and lush semi-tropical walls of foliage, as well as developing a more extensive sweep for the carriage drive.

One of the earliest maps to focus solely on the East Indies, and with northwest Australia named *Beach*, published in Ortelius's *Theatrum Orbis Terrarum*, which was widely regarded as the first modern atlas for having all the maps in a similar size and format. Ortelius was the first to separate ancient and recent geographic knowledge in his maps and to indicate the changes from the old nomenclature to the new. Superbly embellished with a pair of frolicking mermaids, galleons, sea monsters, a crest and decorative strapwork title cartouche engraved by Frans Hogenberg (1539-1590). Ortelius's map of the Indies improved upon the previous cartography of the Moluccas (Spice Islands) by Ramusio 1554, Gastaldi 1562, and Forlani 1565, using more recent Portuguese and Spanish sources. This map, along with Ortelius's map of Asia are the first published works to chart the island of Formosa (Taiwan) and to identify it by that name. The Moluccas were visited by the Italian traveller Varthema who reached the island of Momoch (probably Ternate) in 1505, seven years prior to the Portuguese. In the account of his travels, *Itinerario de Ludouico de Varthema Bolognese*, published in Rome in 1510, he wrote 'Here the cloves grow, and in many other neighbouring islands.'

Suggestions include building barracks in the countryside, and more space in them, and teaching soldiers non-military skills ('all French soldiers can cook'). Major General Tulloch writes in 1858 that army life allowed a soldier to get into habits of idleness and that as a result his pension became insufficient on his retirement. He suggests the soldier learn to build his own barracks, make his own clothes and bread, raise a few vegetables. General William Williams argues in 1866 for 'recreation clubs and regimental canteens ... whose attractions kept the soldiers from the gin shops and still worse rendezvous'. He envisages a downward slide where 'the British soldier ... ends his life on the scaffold for the murder of his officer whom he was sworn to defend'. . 285172

TWO ORIGINAL AUTOGRAPH LETTERS SIGNED 'T. L. MITCHELL', FROM THE SURVEYOR GENERAL'S OFFICE SYDNEY, the first dated 11th October 1843, the second 2nd March 1852.

The first, written to Mr James Upton, Cornwallis, Windsor, is a six line letter acknowledging Upton's application for a License to occupy one Section of Land in the County of Hunter. Mitchell informs Upton that he has submitted the request with his (Mitchell's) report to the Colonial Secretary, for the consideration of His Excellency the Governor. The second, in fifteen lines, informs Upton that in consequence of the sale by auction of 30 acres of land being part of 1200 acres in the County of Hunter under lease to [Upton], his lease is cancelled under the 11th Clause of the Regulation of the 29th March 1848, and advises him to apply to the Colonial Treasurer for the restitution of the rent of the land in question for the unexpired period of the lease. *Mitchell (1792-1855), was Australia's second surveyor general from 1828 to 1855. Surveyor, cartographer, explorer and author, Mitchell was elected to the New South Wales Legislative Council in 1844, but resigned after a few months, finding it impossible to reconcile his role of public servant with that of politician. The death notice of James Upton of Cornwallis, Windsor, appears in the Windsor and Richmond Gazette, 18th August, 1888. The 1828 census lists Upton as 23 years old, born in the Colony, farmer, Protestant. 285169*

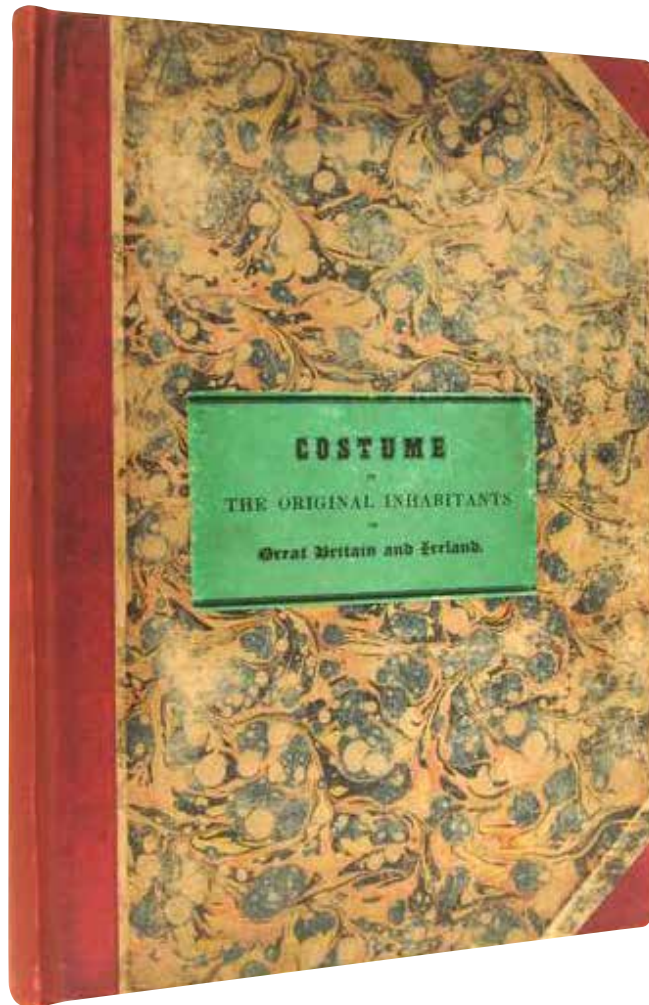

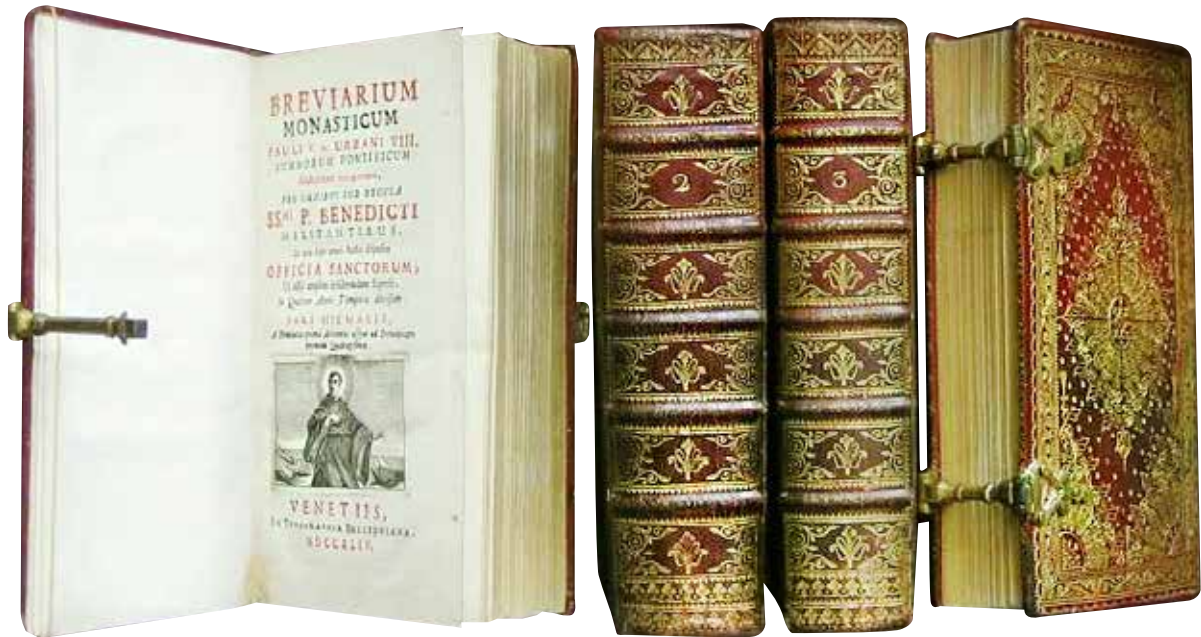

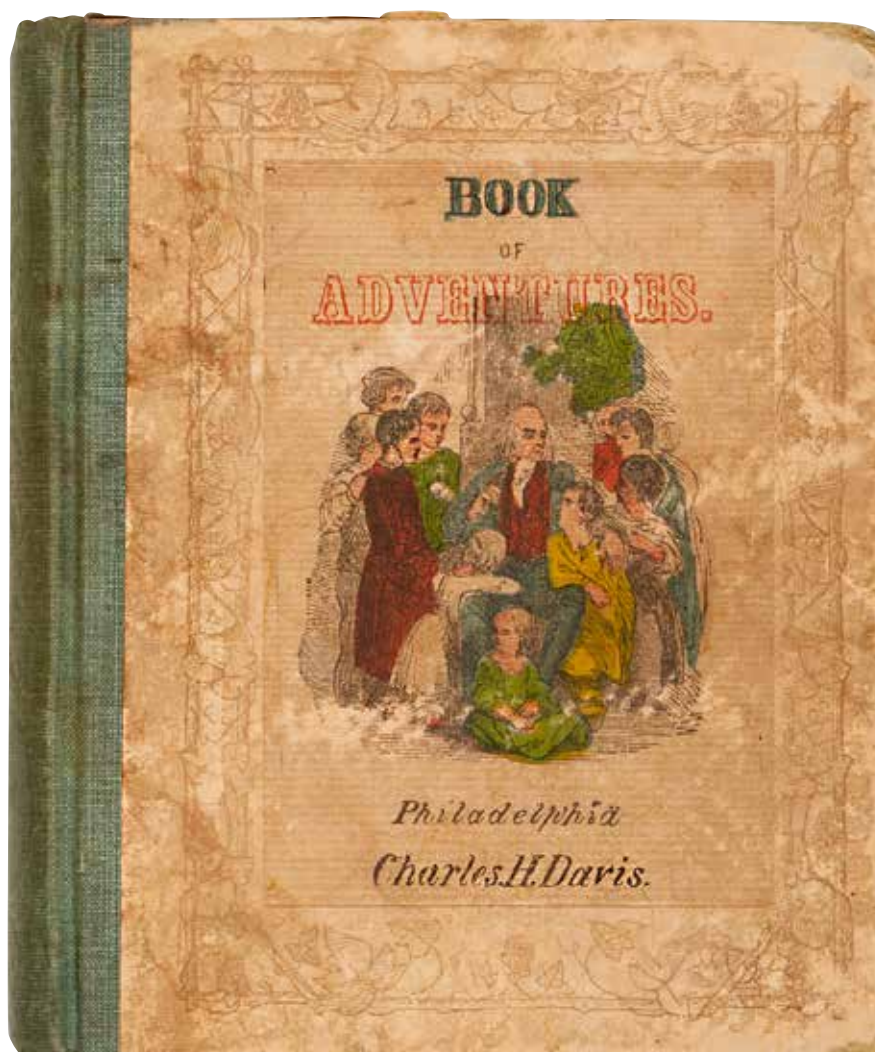

A possibly unrecorded self-portrait of William Bardwell (1836-1929), pioneer Ballarat photographer. It was taken in his Collins Street studio around 1880, following his move to Melbourne in 1879. The National Portrait Gallery holds a carte de visite format self-portrait of Bardwell bearing the imprint of his Ballarat studio, which it dates to 1870. However, given that Bardwell appears to be about the same age (early 40s) in both portraits, it is likely that the NPG's portrait dates to no earlier than around 1878. According to Davies & Stanbury (*Mechanical Eye in Australia*), Bardwell was active at his 21 Collins Street address – his first Melbourne studio – only from 1880, but the DAAO suggests he had already relocated to Melbourne by the end of 1878.

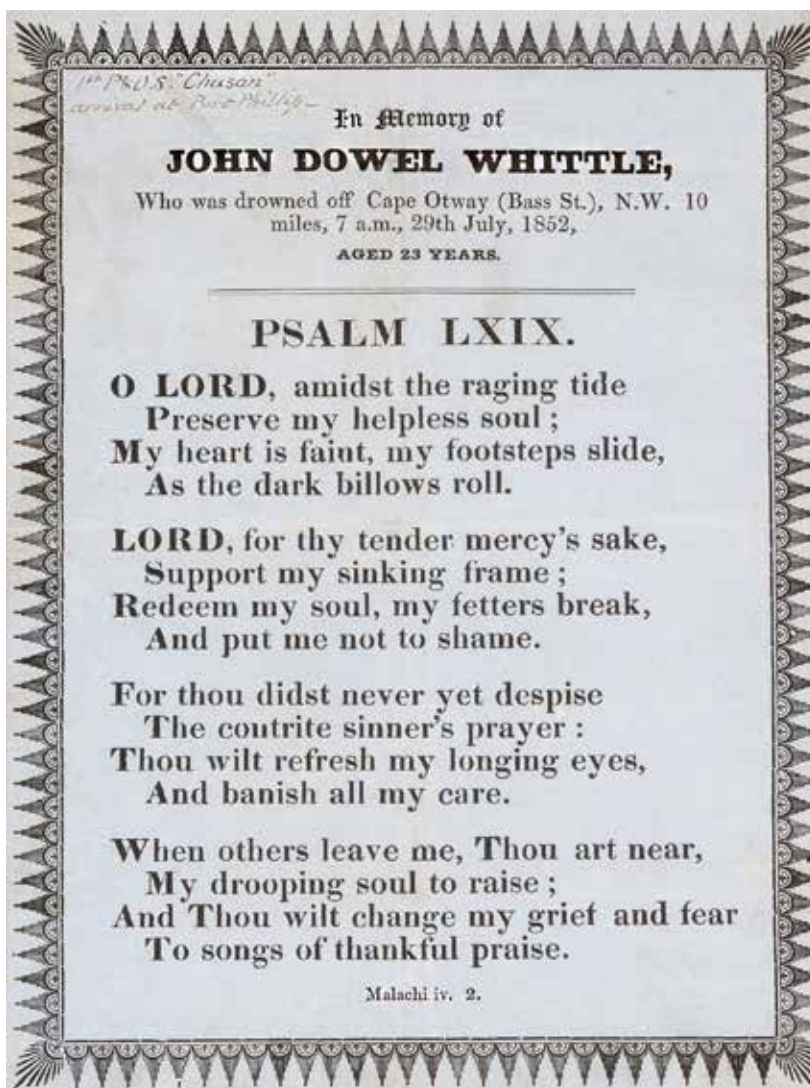

A fine large format original artwork by Norman Lindsay published during the Second World War in *The Bulletin* (28th June, 1944, p.5). The work depicts Australian Labor Prime Minister John Curtin, characterised as an alternate version 'King John', perverting the Magna Carta by forcing a shackled man into signing away his constitutional freedoms. The cartoon references the 1944 Australian Post-War Reconstruction and Democratic Rights referendum, which proposed changes to the Australian Constitution to enact 14 additional powers for the Commonwealth Government, ostensibly to facilitate the transition to peacetime from the period of war. The Bill was put to a vote on 19 August 1944 and defeated by 54% of the electorate.

The caption reads :

MAGNA CHARTA IN REVERSE. On June 15 (Old Style), 1215, the other King John agreed that "No freeman shall be arrested or detained in prison or in any way molested unless by the lawful judgment of his peers and by the law of the land ... To no one will we sell, to no one will we refuse or delay, right or justice."

A rare and powerful Norman Lindsay commentary on Australian democracy.

David Roberts. This page is from Egypt and the Holy Land, titled "Fragment of the Great Colossus at the Memnonium, Thebes". (Whole double page, elephant folio). This fragment is of the Temple showing circular columns, with lotus form capitals. The fragment of a statue of Ramesses II is, however the great wonder of the Memnonium. (nowadays known as the Ramesseum) It was formed of one stupendous mass of syenite or granite and represented the king seated on a throne, with his hands resting on his knees. When complete it weighed over 900 tons and was thrown down by an earthquake in the 80 BCE. The colossal fragments lie scattered round the pedestal. This statue is well known as the muse for Shelley's, "Ozymandi-as" one of his most famous poems. The printers name F.G Moon Threadneedle St and the date March 1st 1847 is underneath the page. This page is in excellent condition and well framed in stunning gold leaf frame in a cross hatch pattern.

The explanatory text reflects a spirit of benevolent pedagogy. Take the description of the Emu: 'These birds are widely spread over the southern part of New Holland, and the neighbouring islands. They are met with at Port Philip and King George's Sound... It is sometimes coursed for sport; being pursued by well-trained dogs... This, however, is a cruel amusement. We have no right to seek our pleasure in a dumb creature's pain...'

Aside from the Australian fauna, the collection includes over thirty attractive bird plates and all manner of old world mammals.

Hastings Elwin was a rather grand figure, friend of the poet Thomas Moore, elected to the NSW Legislative Council in 1843.

The Gold Coast was a British Crown colony on the Gulf of Guinea in West Africa from 1821 until its independence in 1957 when it became Ghana. The British Red Cross was established in the Gold Coast in 1932. An early fund-raising activity was the publication of this cookbook, sold in what is now Ghana and Nigeria.

Written by approximately 80 local women, The Gold Coast Cook Book is similar to most colonial and Empire related 'fund-raising' books for its emphasis on baked goods, home duties and housekeeping. Unlike other colonial cookery books, it is notable for its wide and enthusiastic use of local West African foodstuffs.

The contemporary advertisements also give a glimpse of late colonial West African commerce and society.

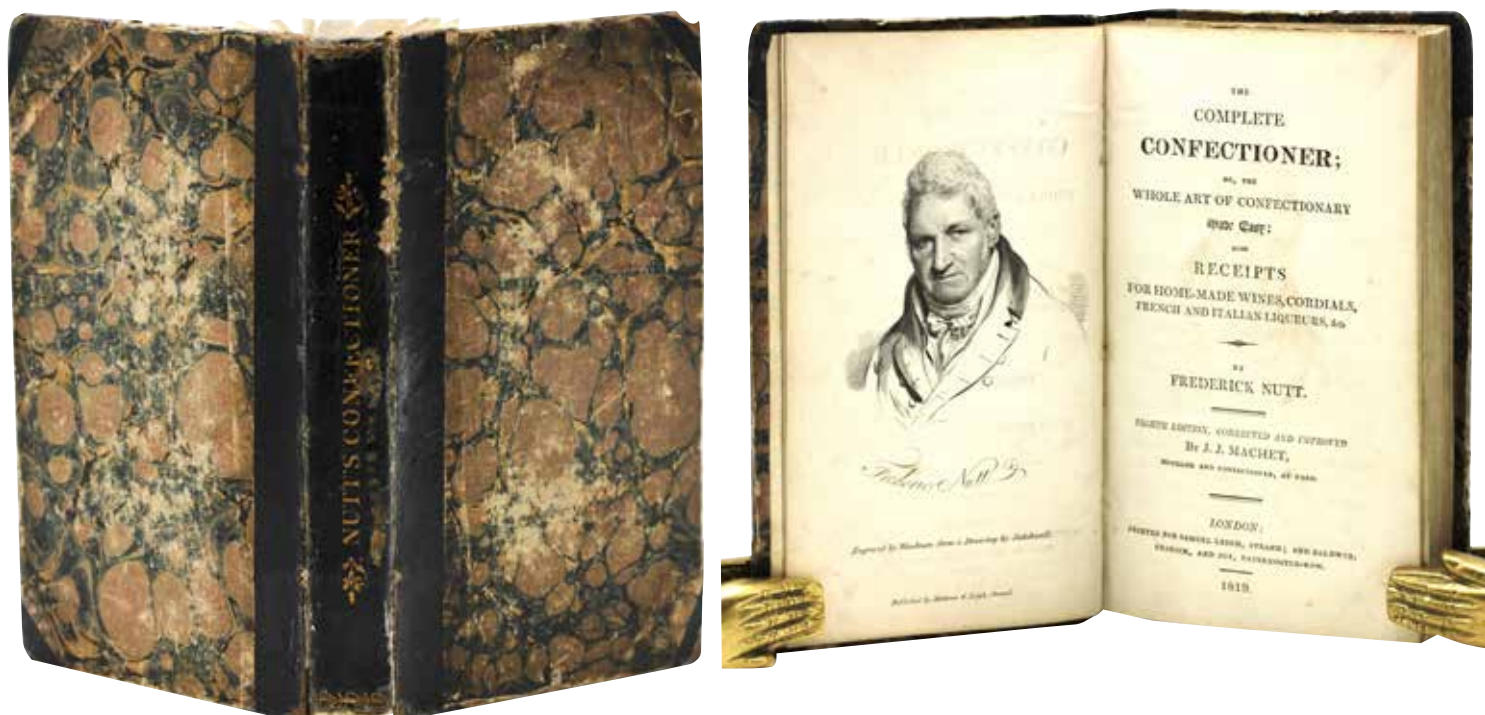
A lesser known work by Kitchiner, a Regency period eccentric, epicure, and writer, providing instruction on losing weight, diets, sleeping and siestas, clothes, heating and cooling, fresh air, exercise and wine as well as a large chapter of aphorisms, stories, anecdotes, analogous tables and charts, somewhat in the style of Brillat-Savarin; with cross-referenced recipes throughout the book for dining, eating, and maintaining one's digestion (from his wildly popular *The Cook's Oracle*, 4th Ed). Recipes aside, a mixture of common-sense and nonsense.

Ironically, notwithstanding his advice here, Kitchiner died at the relatively young age of 49.

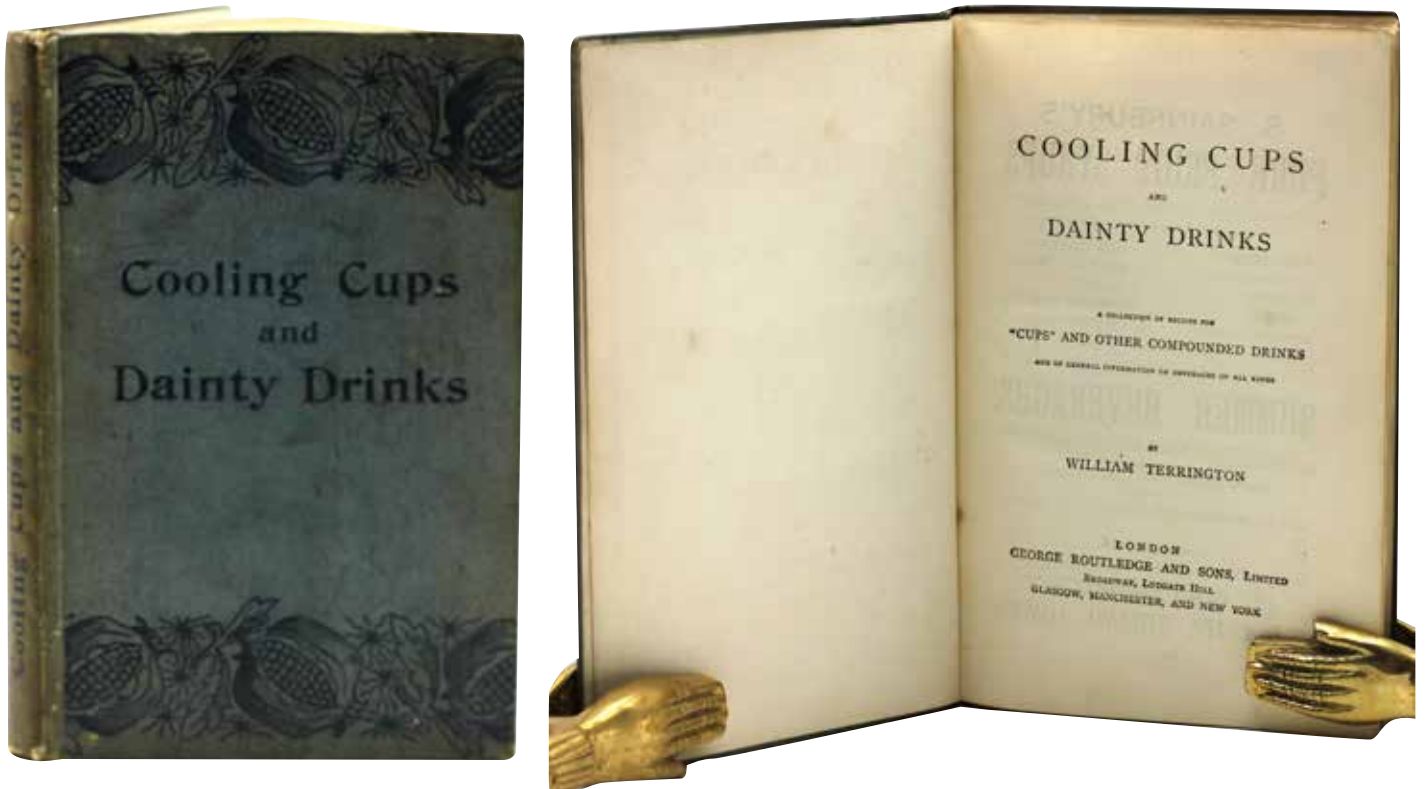
Nutt was a pastry chef and confectioner of the highest level to the upper levels of Georgian society. His recipes including 31 different ice creams show a higher level of precision and a wider range of unusual flavours than domestic cookery books of the time, although he assumed much when describing the method.

Published to enthusiastic reviews, *Cooling Cups* was the first British book to contain cocktail recipes. It provides a detailed insight into Victorian drinking habits and records the move from traditional wine cups and punches to American style 'cocktails' and iced drinks. Nothing is known about William Terrington. David Wondrich¹ suggests that he is a 'probably pseudonymous author' associated with the Wenham Lake Ice Co². The publisher's advertisements of the day refer to him being the House Steward for a member of society.

Save for some decorative changes, the text is the same as the first edition.

An unrecorded later imprint of Britain's first cocktail book.

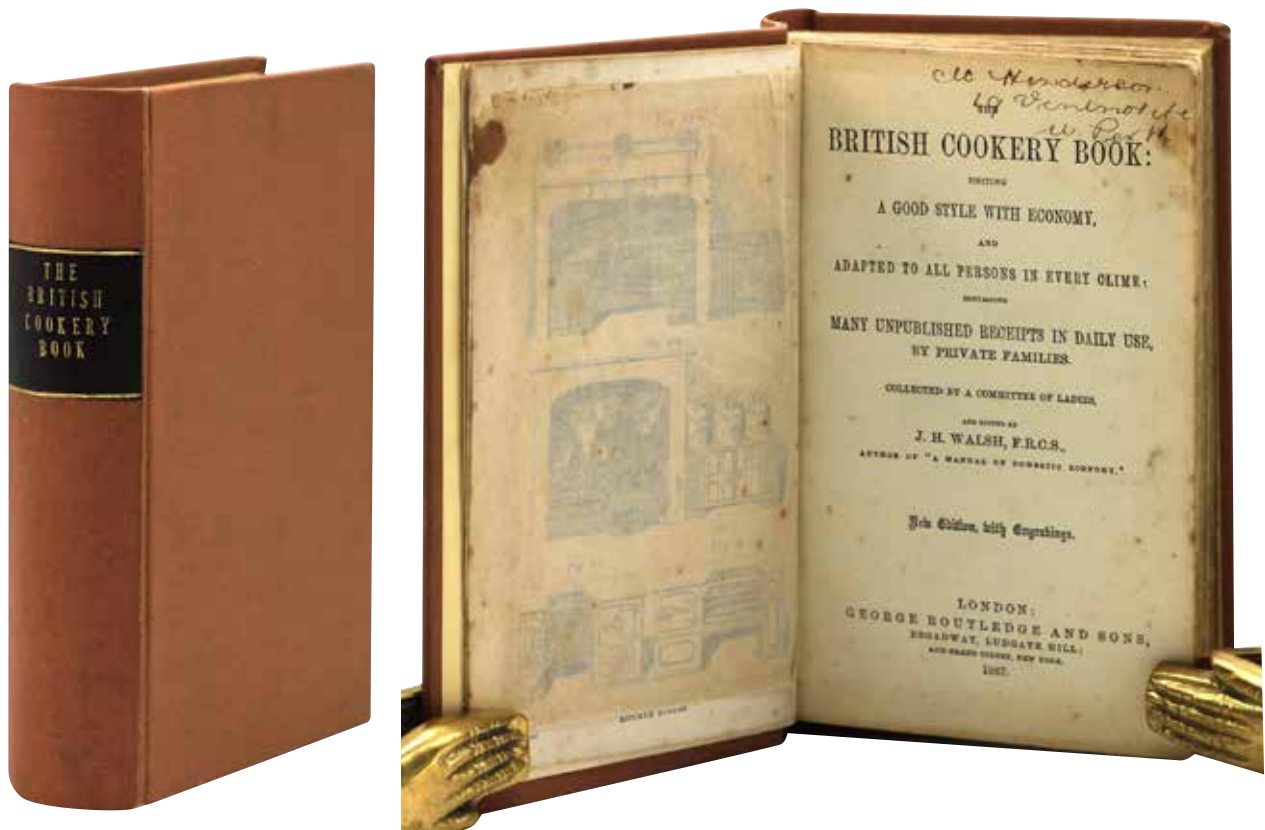

Walsh 'edited' several cookery books 'authored by a committee of ladies': *A Manual of Domestic Economy*, 1857, *The English Cookery Book*, G Routledge & Co, 1858 and *The British Cookery Book*, Routledge, Warne, and Routledge, 1863 and onwards. *The British Cookery Book* is a republishing of *The English Cookery Book* and both note that most of the recipes contained were from *A Manual of Domestic Economy*.

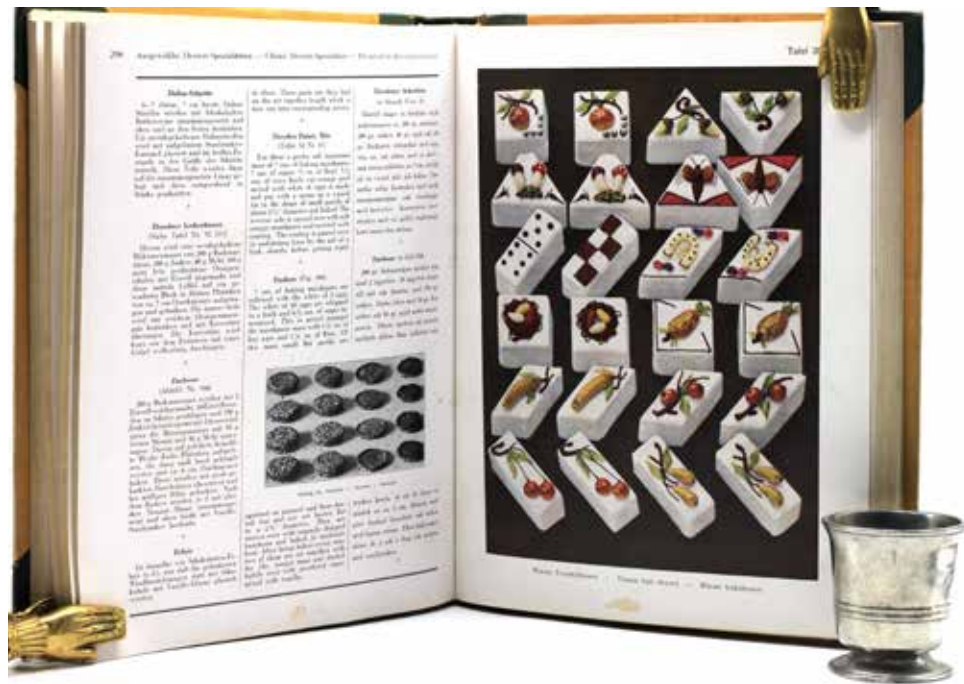

In 1913 Weber, a Dresden based confectionery teacher and supplier published his first book *Praktische Konditorei-Kunst* combining new technical advances in photography and printing with a unique flair for illustrating confectionery practices. Weber's books were widely consulted by professional bakers throughout the world as the foremost professional pastry and confectionery manuals.

Schule und Praxis was Weber's fifth, and most lavish and international book, containing over 1000 recipes for all types of baked sweet goods including bombes, tortes, decorations, cremes, centrepieces and more; many illustrated. The designs, some exuberantly elaborate and extravagant, were highly innovative and defined professional patisserie and confectionery until the 1970s.

An excellent solid copy of a significant professional patisserie book.

Selina Read (1829-1915) was the daughter of Captain Thomas Martin Fenton J.P. (c.1789-1836) of Allanvale, New Norfolk, Tasmania and his wife Leonora (d1856). In 1854 she married Robert Cartwright Read (1829-1903), son of George Frederick Read and Elizabeth née Terry and owner of the 1800-acre pastoral estate Redlands [extant] near New Norfolk.

The elegance of the women picnickers with their umbrellas and patterned dresses, is equalled by that of the Chinese man holding a walking stick and sporting a large flower in his buttonhole. The Reads leased land to the government for the famous Salmon Ponds hatchery and many of their house guests— among them the governor Sir Frederick Weld – were attracted by the salmon fishing.

When Sir William Don, Bart. (1825-1862) arrived in Melbourne in December 1861 he was well-known – for becoming an actor to pay his creditors, for drunkenly vandalising his Edinburgh train in 1849, for being imprisoned for debt, and for the celebrity crowds his performances attracted in England and America. Under George Coppin's direction, the 'majestic' 6'6" Sir William opened at Melbourne's Theatre Royal in January 1861, then toured nationally. He died aged 37 in Hobart in March 1862, four days after playing in his hit role Elizabeth I in the burlesque *Kenilworth*. Leslie Stephen (*DNB*, London) wrote of 'the romantic vicissitudes of fortune' and the 'crowded' incidents in his short life.

In Australia, he had played for the Richmond and the Inglewood Cricket clubs and Sir William Don was the name of a champion trotting horse in Victoria by 1862, a Gold-Mining Company in Ballarat from 1861, and hotels in Ballarat (1866-1922) and Hobart (c.1871-2010s). Claiming '*Sir William Don Redivivus*', Australian newspapers reported in 1876 that an '*impudent*' actor had appeared at the Fort Theatre, Bombay, in India, under the name 'which was once familiar to every playgoer in Victoria'.

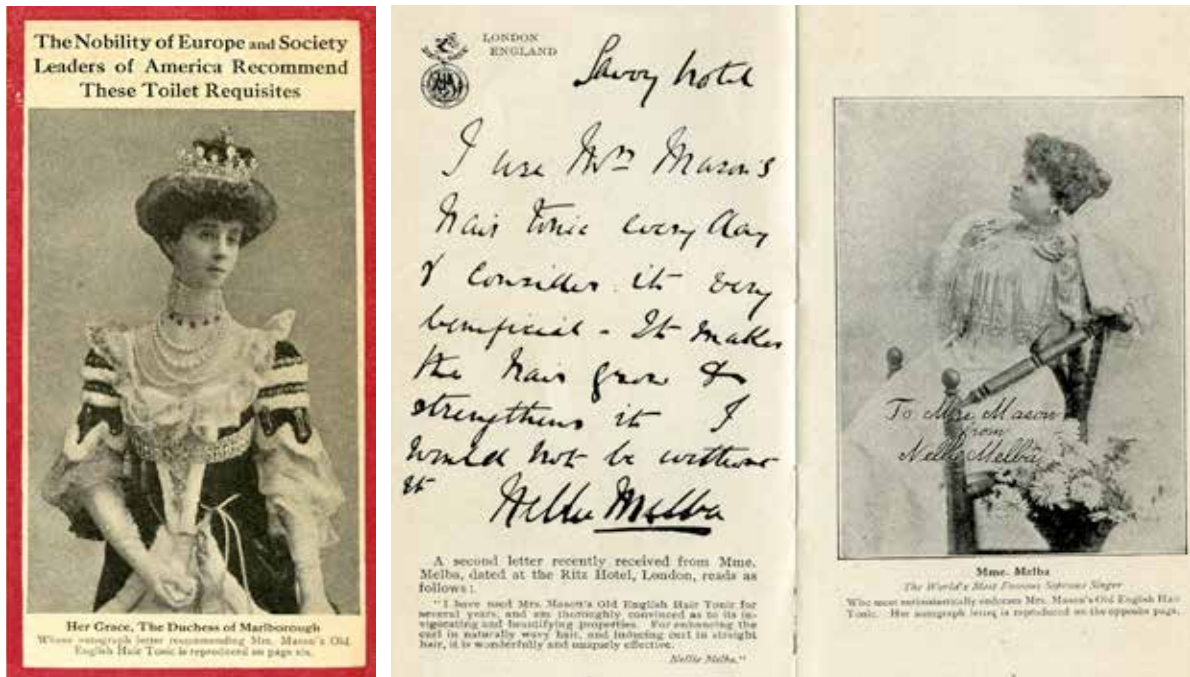

The image features five of the members of the Italian opera troupe who came to Australia in 1924 as part of The Dame Nellie Melba – J C Williamson Ltd Grand Opera Season, which opened in May 1924 in Melbourne and toured nationally. Baritone, Antonio Laffi, who stands on the running board of the group's motor car, had a significant reputation in Italy at the time. Mezzosoprano Carmen Tornari, wife of Amleto Tornari, the prompter, is identified to the back as '*Madre of Nellie Melba*'.

On Monday 2 May, Melbourne-born Nellie Melba Guiseppina Tornari had been christened at St Patrick's Cathedral, before a crowd of thousands: '*people were standing on seats and climbed the railing of the chancel*'. A large percentage of the crowd were said to be Italians (SMH 3 June 1924). Melba's car was caught in traffic and arrived after the christening.

The booklet promotes 'the Hair Tonic used by Mrs. Kate Seaton Mason, the noted English Hair Specialist, in treating the hair of the Vanderbilt family, the Duchess of Marlborough, Mme. Melba, Lady Lillian Churchill ... and many other women of English Nobility, and many other society women of New York, London and Paris'. Melba's autograph letter of endorsement, sent from the Savoy Hotel, London is reproduced along with a portrait inscribed 'To Mrs Mason from Nellie Melba' (p4-5), who 'most enthusiastically endorses Mrs. Mason's Old English Hair Tonic.' Melba (and fellow Australian singer Dame Clara Butt) also endorsed Royal Trentham Bouquet Perfume (*Staffordshire Sentinel* 20 Dec 1917).

Robert Montgomery reflects European trends established in the 1920s: the craze for Egyptomania after the discovery of Tutankhamen's tomb in 1922, the stylised geometric decorative style associated with the Exposition des Arts Décoratifs, 1925, which also cemented the rising interest in African and other non-Western art movements, and the 'exoticism' of black women performers, especially of "Black Venus" Josephine Baker, the African-American star of the Folies Bergère, Paris. Despite her status in France, she was subject to racist harangues in the USA, and was active in the civil rights movement.

Hobart-born Robert Barron Montgomery (1912-1964), artist and printmaker, was one of the small group of Tasmanian modernists active in the 1930s. He studied for a Commercial Art Diploma at the Hobart Technical College. He is often confused with his surveyor father, an amateur painter of traditional landscapes, who exhibited at the Art Society of Tasmania as R.B. Montgomery.

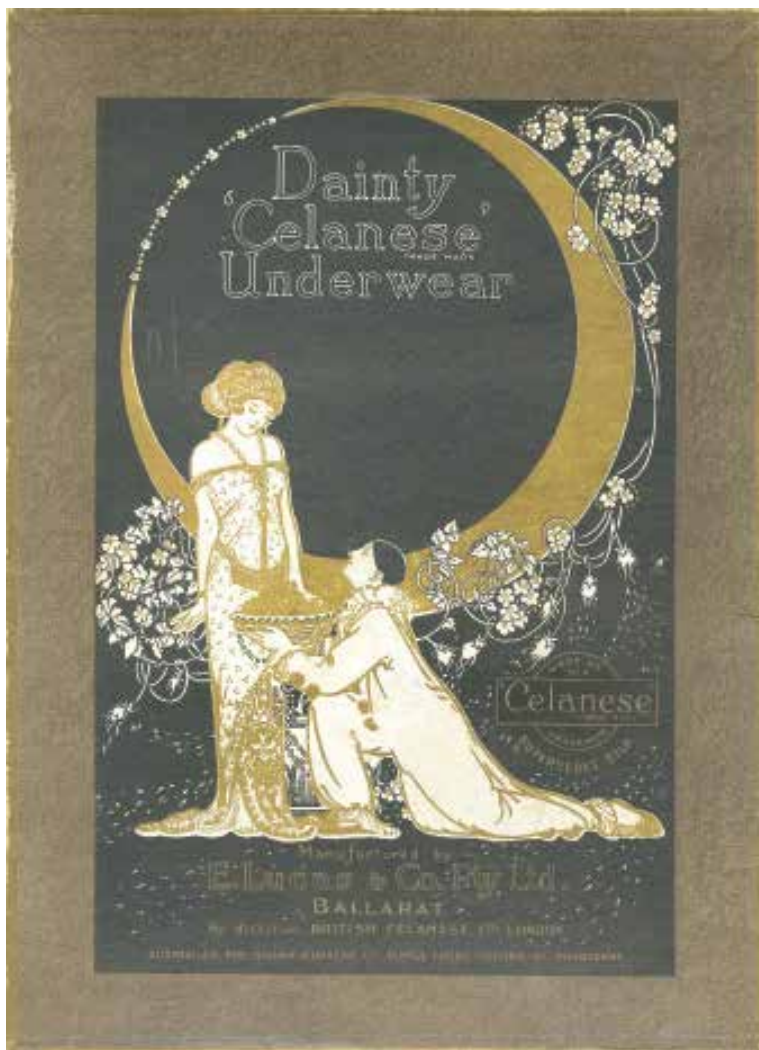

Large chocolate box, 23.5 x 41cm x 6.5 cm, the inside of the lid gilt-lettered with 'Bates' CHOCOLATES, City Depot: 41 Swanston Street, Melbourne', & 'Under the Patronage of His Excellency the Governor-General' above the Royal Coat of Arms. Good condition; some light age stains to cardboard interior & to covering printed linen floral & stripe fabric.

Charles Bates started his chocolate manufacturing business in Melbourne in the 1860s. Bates' Chocolate Depot was operating at Flinders Street by the 1880s and a second 'elegantly appointed shop' opened at 41 Swanston Street on the corner of Flinders Street in 1895. His cuisinier, Herr Carl Stratmann, created a life-size figure of a boy made of chocolate for the windows: 'All the walls are lined with long panel mirrors set off by black and gilt frames. The stock of confectionery is sorted into glass cases which present a splendid sight at night when illuminated with incandescent electric lights. A fine show case in the centre exhibits an immense number of fancy boxes, and a number of fine pedestals ... are arranged round the counter, with bowl-shaped glass shades containing a variety of tempting sweets' (*Table Talk* 17 May 1895). When the building sold in 1921, Bates purchased another Flinders Street property for the business.

Winifred Atwell (c.1914-1983), pharmacist and classical pianist, found fame as a variety performer in England with a repertoire of boogie-woogie, ballads, and swing numbers. Her disc *Black and White Rag*, sold over a million copies. Later, at Sydney's Pagewood studios, she would make 13 television films for worldwide distribution.

Atwell broke attendance records on her 1955 tour of Australia. On her 1961 tour she appeared at Sydney nightclub Chequers. She spoke out continually about Australia's discrimination against Aborigines and its White Australia policy: 'I can only assume ... that they don't wish to be overcrowded by people of color – such as myself. [My husband, Reginald (Lew) Levisohn,] can enter and live in Australia without question whereas I have to make special applications for a permit both to enter or live in Australia.' Atwell settled in Sydney in 1970, on the basis of her 'special qualifications' (i.e. her celebrity standing), but it was only after the Whitlam Government made changes to the White Australia Policy that she was naturalised in 1981.

The Argus of 22 August 1955 reported that 'The packed house went wild with enthusiasm at the end of the Winifred Atwell season at the Tivoli on Saturday night. After taking 16 curtain calls she played a medley of popular numbers on her "honky-tonk" piano, finishing with "Waltzing Matilda" and "Now is the Hour", as the audience joined in and sang.'

David N. Martin, who had brought the entertainer to Australia, remarked that she had broken all Australian box office records: 'She earned £50,000 in her 13 weeks' Sydney season, and equalled it in her Melbourne season of 14 weeks, Backstage, Aborigines headed headed by Mrs Margaret Tucker, better known as "Lalardia" and Lillian Nicholl, daughter of Pastor Doug Nicholl, presented her with a plaque from the Aboriginal community on which was carved miniatures of Aboriginal weapons undertaken at Cherbourg in Queensland.
